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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. A new section of the Economic Development
18	Department Act is enacted to read:
19	"[NEW MATERIAL] SOLO-WORKER PROGRAM
20	A. As used in this section:
21	(1) "economic-base job" means a job in which
22	sixty percent or more of the revenue generated from the goods
23	or services produced derives from outside of the state;
24	(2) "program agency" means a certified
25	business incubator, a community college or an organization

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whose purpose is to create jobs and promote economic development; and

- (3) "solo worker" means a person who is engaged in full-time employment and whose employer, if any, does not supply the office space or amenities used to perform the person's work.
- B. The "solo-worker program" is created in the department. The purpose of the solo-worker program is to improve the state's rural and urban economies by creating and sustaining economic-base jobs and expanding businesses owned and operated by solo workers engaged in economic-base jobs.
- C. To carry out the purpose of the solo-worker program, the department shall provide matching funding to program agencies for advancing initiatives that:
- (1) create opportunities for residents to become solo workers engaged in economic-base jobs;
- (2) support the continued employment and business expansion of existing solo workers engaged in economic-base jobs;
- (3) recruit from outside of the state solo workers engaged in economic-base jobs; and
- (4) make the state and its local communities more competitive for creating, attracting and retaining soloworker jobs."
- SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.--Five hundred thousand dollars .198205.1

(\$500,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the
economic development department for expenditure in fiscal year
2016 to implement the provisions of the solo-worker program.
Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of
fiscal year 2016 shall revert to the general fund.

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
