HOUSE BILL 497

RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE; RECONCILING DIFFERENCES IN THE DEFINITION OF "HOUSEHOLD MEMBER" IN THE CRIMES AGAINST HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS ACT, THE FAMILY VIOLENCE PROTECTION ACT AND THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 30-3-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, Chapter 221, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:

"30-3-11. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Crimes Against Household Members Act:

A. "household member" means a spouse, former spouse, parent, present or former stepparent, present or former [parent in-law] parent-in-law, grandparent, grandparent-in-law, a co-parent of a child or a person with whom a person has had a continuing personal relationship. Cohabitation is not

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necessary to be deemed a household member for the purposes of the Crimes Against Household Members Act; and

- B. "continuing personal relationship" means a dating or intimate relationship."
- SECTION 2. Section 31-1-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1979, Chapter 178, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

"31-1-7. ARREST WITHOUT WARRANT--LIABILITY.--

- A. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary, a peace officer may arrest a person and take that person into custody without a warrant when the officer is at the scene of a domestic disturbance and has probable cause to believe that the person has committed an assault or a battery upon a household member. As used in this section: "household member" means a spouse, former spouse, [family member, including a relative] parent, present or former stepparent, present or former [in-law, child or] parent-in-law, grandparent, grandparent-in-law, co-parent of a child or a person with whom the victim has had a continuing personal relationship. Cohabitation is not necessary to be deemed a household member for purposes of this section.
- B. No peace officer shall be held criminally or civilly liable for making an arrest pursuant to this section, provided [he] the officer acts in good faith and without malice.
- C. Whether or not an arrest is made pursuant to .198732.1

4	SECTION 3. Section 40-13-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1987,
5	Chapter 286, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:
6	"40-13-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Family Violence
7	Protection Act:
8	A. "continuing personal relationship" means a
9	dating or intimate relationship;
10	B. "co-parents" means persons who have a child in
11	common, regardless of whether they have been married or have
12	lived together at any time;
13	C. "court" means the district court of the judicial
14	district where an alleged victim of domestic abuse resides or
15	is found;
16	D. "domestic abuse":
17	(1) means an incident of stalking or sexual
18	assault whether committed by a household member or not;
19	(2) means an incident by a household member
20	against another household member consisting of or resulting in:
21	(a) physical harm;
22	(b) severe emotional distress;
23	(c) bodily injury or assault;
24	(d) a threat causing imminent fear of
25	bodily injury by any household member;
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1	(e) criminal trespass;
2	(f) criminal damage to property;
3	(g) repeatedly driving by a residence or
4	work place;
5	(h) telephone harassment;
6	(i) harassment; or
7	(j) harm or threatened harm to children
8	as set forth in this paragraph; and
9	(3) does not mean the use of force in self-
10	defense or the defense of another;
11	E. "household member" means a spouse, former
12	spouse, parent, present or former stepparent, present or former
13	[parent in-law] <u>parent-in-law</u> , grandparent, grandparent-in-law,
14	[child, stepchild, grandchild] co-parent of a child or a person
15	with whom the petitioner has had a continuing personal
16	relationship. Cohabitation is not necessary to be deemed a
17	household member for purposes of this section;
18	F. "mutual order of protection" means an order of
19	protection that includes provisions that protect both parties;
20	G. "order of protection" means an injunction or a
21	restraining or other court order granted for the protection of
22	a victim of domestic abuse;
23	H. "protected party" means a person protected by an
24	order of protection; and
25	I. "restrained party" means a person who is
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restrained by an order of protection."

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
