16	SECTION 1. Section 24-5-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1959,
17	Chapter 329, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"24-5-3. EXEMPTION FROM IMMUNIZATION
19	A. Any minor child through [his] the child's parent
20	or guardian may file with the health authority charged with the
21	duty of enforcing the immunization laws:
22	(1) a certificate of a duly licensed physician
23	stating that the physical condition of the child is such that
24	immunization would seriously endanger the life or health of the
25	child; or

2	affirmation from an officer of a recognized religious
3	denomination that [ <del>such</del> ] <u>the</u> child's parents or guardians are

5	requires reliance upon prayer or spiritual means alone for
6	healing [ <del>or</del>
7	(3) affidavits or written affirmation from his
8	parent or legal guardian that his religious beliefs, held
9	either individually or jointly with others, do not permit the
10	administration of vaccine or other immunizing agent].
11	B. Upon filing and approval of such certificate,
12	[affidavits] affidavit or affirmation, the child is exempt from
13	the legal requirement of immunization for a period not to
14	exceed nine months on the basis of any one certificate,
15	[affidavits] affidavit or affirmation."
