15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. Section 61-9A-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
17	Chapter 49, Section 11, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"61-9A-11. PROFESSIONAL CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH
19	COUNSELORREQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSUREThe board shall issue a
20	license as a professional clinical mental health counselor to
21	any person who files a completed application accompanied by the
22	required fees and who submits satisfactory evidence that the
23	applicant:

F. has undergone a criminal background check, at cost to the applicant, in accordance with board rules."
