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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. Section 13-1-104 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1984,
16	Chapter 65, Section 77, as amended) is amended to read:
17	"13-1-104. COMPETITIVE SEALED BIDSPUBLIC NOTICE
18	A. An invitation for bids or a notice thereof shall
19	be published not less than ten calendar days prior to the date
20	set forth for the opening of bids <u>as follows:</u>
21	(1) in the case of purchases made by the state
22	purchasing agent, the invitation or notice shall be published:
23	(a) at least once in at least three
24	newspapers of general circulation in this state [in addition,
25	an invitation or notice may be published]; or
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1 (b) electronically on the state 2 purchasing agent's web site that is maintained for that 3 purpose; and (2) in the case of purchases made by other 4 central purchasing offices, the invitation or notice shall be 5 published: 6 7 (a) at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the area in which the central purchasing 8 9 office is located [These]; or (b) electronically on the central 10 purchasing office's web site. 11 12 B. The requirements of publication are in addition to any other procedures that may be adopted by central 13 14 purchasing offices to notify prospective bidders that bids will be received, including publication in a trade journal, if 15 available. 16 If there is no newspaper of general circulation 17 C. in the area in which the central purchasing office is located, 18 such other <u>printed</u> notice may be given as is commercially 19 20 reasonable. [B.] D. Central purchasing offices shall send 21 copies of the notice or invitation for bids involving the 22 expenditure of more than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to 23 those businesses that have signified in writing an interest in 24 submitting bids for particular categories of items of tangible 25 .198661.1SA

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<u>underscored material = new</u> [bracketed material] = delete 1 personal property, construction and services and that have paid 2 any required fees. A central purchasing office may set 3 different registration fees for different categories of services, construction or items of tangible personal property, 4 but such fees shall be related to the actual, direct cost of 5 furnishing copies of the notice or invitation for bids to the 6 7 prospective bidders. The fees shall be used exclusively for the purpose of furnishing copies of the notice or invitation 8 9 for bids of proposed procurements to prospective bidders.

[C.] <u>E.</u> A central purchasing office may satisfy the requirement of sending copies of a notice or invitation for bids by distributing the documents to prospective bidders through electronic media. [Central purchasing offices shall not require that prospective bidders receive a notice or invitation for bids through electronic media.

 $\mathbf{P}_{\mathbf{r}}$] $\mathbf{F}_{\mathbf{r}}$ As used in this section, "prospective bidders" includes persons considering submission of a bid as a general contractor for the construction contract and persons who may submit bids to a general contractor for work to be subcontracted pursuant to the construction contract. Central purchasing offices shall make copies of invitations for bids for construction contracts available to prospective bidders. A central purchasing office may require prospective bidders who have requested documents for bid on a construction contract to pay a deposit for a copy of the documents for bid. The deposit .198661.1SA

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1	shall equal the full cost of reproduction and delivery of the
2	documents for bid. The deposit, less delivery charges, shall
3	be refunded if the documents for bid are returned in usable
4	condition within the time limits specified in the documents for
5	bid, which time limits shall be no less than ten calendar days
6	from the date of the bid opening. All forfeited deposits shall
7	be credited to the funds of the applicable central purchasing
8	office."
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
