21	WHEREAS, the required competencies in mathematics for
22	entry-level elementary teachers are listed in
23	Section 6.61.2.10 NMAC; and
24	WHEREAS, the list of required competencies is used for
25	college course development and licensure tests; and

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the secretary of public education be requested to study the feasibility of updating required competencies in mathematics for entry-level elementary teachers; and
