### **SUMMARY**

The House Regulatory and Public Affaris Committee (HRPAC) substitute for HB 188 would impose a stricter penalty for violations of class A county ordinances regulating the mining of sand, gravel, and rock aggregate (SGA), amending Section 4-37-3 NMSA 1978.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No fiscal impacts.

#### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to the Energy, Minerals, and Natural Resources Department (EMNRD), local governments are responsible for the regulation of SGA mining operations, primarily through county ordinances.

## RELATIONSHIP

This bill relates to HB 190, which would extend the coverage of the NM Mining Act to include SGA mining operations (Section 69, Article 36 NMSA 1978).
