SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 567 would rename UNM HSC’s center for telehealth the “Stephen Easley Telehealth Videoconferencing Center.” A small businessowner, Stephen Easley had worked in and with state agencies, served as a city commissioner in Alamogordo, and was elected, in 2011, to serve in the New Mexico House of Representatives. He died while in office.
