# SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The Forestry Division recognizes the critical need to protect, restore, and maintain functioning watersheds for a variety or reasons, including impacts to wildlife habitat and species of concern.

The division regularly coordinates with other agencies in planning and conducting restoration activities. Additionally the division currently implements and supports many opportunities for watershed restoration with state and federal partners throughout New Mexico. EMNRD received a \$6.2 million capital outlay appropriation for forest thinning and watershed restoration beginning in FY15.
