### **SUMMARY**

### Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 54 increases the maximum allowable travel mileage fee a notary may charge from a set amount of 30 cents per mile to the standard mileage rate set by the Internal Revenue Service on January 1<sup>st</sup> of the previous year.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SB54 will not have a fiscal impact on the State of New Mexico.

#### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The maximum fees that may be charged by a notary public for notarial acts are set by statute.

The provisions of SB 54 would allow a notary public to charge up to 56 cents per mile traveled based on the IRS standard mileage rate set January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014.

SOS reports there are currently 35,000 notary publics active in New Mexico.
