AN ACT

RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE; AMENDING THE FAMILY VIOLENCE
PROTECTION ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF AN EXTENDED ORDER
OF PROTECTION AGAINST A PERSON CONVICTED OF CRIMINAL SEXUAL
PENETRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. A new section of the Family Violence Protection Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] EXTENDED ORDER OF PROTECTION.--

A. In the sentencing proceeding for a person convicted of criminal sexual penetration pursuant to Section 30-9-11 NMSA 1978, a prosecutor may request that the criminal court grant the victim an order of protection to remain in effect for the duration of the criminal court's jurisdiction over the person.

- At any time after the expiration of a criminal court's jurisdiction over a person against whom an order of protection was granted pursuant to a request pursuant to Subsection A of this section, the victim may:
- file a petition for an order of protection against the person; and
- submit evidence of the person's conviction for criminal sexual penetration as cause for the court to grant the order of protection.
- Based on evidence submitted pursuant to Subsection B of this section, a court may take judicial notice of the facts that led to a person's conviction for criminal sexual penetration and a victim shall not be required to appear before the court on the victim's petition for an order of protection; provided, however, that another person may appear on the victim's behalf.
- D. A court may grant an order of protection pursuant to this section for any length of time, including for a victim's lifetime.
- Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection C of Section 40-13-6 NMSA 1978, an order of protection granted pursuant to this section shall continue until the expiration provided in the order, if any, or until modified or rescinded upon a motion by the victim."
- SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the .202672.1

provisions of this act is July 1, 2016.
