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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. Section 29-13-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983,
18	Chapter 289, Section 7, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"29-13-7. EXPENDITURE LIMITATIONCONTROL
20	A. Amounts distributed from the fund shall be
21	expended only for the following:
22	(1) the repair and purchase of law enforcement
23	apparatus and equipment, including the financing and
24	refinancing thereof, that meet minimum nationally recognized
25	standards;
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1 (2) the purchase of law enforcement equipment, 2 including protective vests, for police dogs; 3 expenses associated with advanced law (3) enforcement planning and training; 4 (4) maintaining the balance of the peace 5 officers' survivors fund at a minimum amount of three hundred 6 7 fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000); complying with match or contribution 8 (5) 9 requirements for the receipt of federal funds relating to criminal justice programs; [and] 10 (6) no more than fifty percent of the 11 12 replacement salaries of municipal and county law enforcement personnel of municipalities or counties rated as Class 1 in 13 Paragraph (1) of Subsection B of Section 29-13-4 NMSA 1978 14 participating in basic law enforcement training; or 15 (7) <u>until June 30, 2021, lump-sum payments</u> 16 17 that: (a) are requested by a municipality or 18 county for the purpose of retaining uniformed law enforcement 19 20 officers who: 1) perform patrol duties; 2) are certified pursuant to the Law Enforcement Training Act; and 3) have 21 twenty or more years of actual service credit earned under a 22 municipal police coverage plan as determined by the public 23 employees retirement association; 24 (b) are received by a law enforcement 25

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1	officer pursuant to the provisions of this paragraph in an
2	amount that is matched by a municipal or county payment to the
3	law enforcement officer; and
4	(c) shall not constitute base salaries
5	or wages or be considered to be salary or be used for
6	determining pensions under the Public Employees Retirement Act.
7	B. Amounts distributed from the fund shall be
8	expended only pursuant to approved budgets and upon duly
9	executed vouchers approved as required by law."
10	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
11	provisions of this act is July 1, 2016.
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
