C. ensure that all behavioral health services, including mental health and substance abuse services, that are provided, contracted for or approved are in compliance with the requirements of Section 9-7-6.4 NMSA 1978;

D. assume responsibility for and implement adult mental health and substance abuse services in the state in coordination with the children, youth and families department;

E. for nonviolent adult and juvenile offenders who have behavioral health diagnoses, create, implement and continually evaluate the effectiveness of a framework for targeted, individualized interventions that address those persons' behavioral health needs and connect them to resources and services that reduce the likelihood of recidivism, detention and incarceration, such as supportive housing, public assistance, medical assistance, behavioral health therapy and employment training;

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.--Two hundred fifty thousand
dollars (\$250,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the
behavioral health services division of the human services
department for expenditure in fiscal year 2017 to carry out the
provisions of this act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance
remaining at the end of fiscal year 2017 shall revert to the
general fund.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of theprovisions of this act is July 1, 2016.
