18	SECTION 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS1980

21	A. A correctional officer who was employed and
22	physically present at the penitentiary of New Mexico during the
23	riot that occurred from February 2 to February 4, 1980, or, if
24	deceased, the deceased's personal representative or other
25	appropriate person as determined by the secretary of

1 corrections, may be entitled to compensation as provided in 2 this section.

3 Β. The corrections department shall: identify surviving correctional officers, 4 (1) or, if any are deceased, the deceased's personal representative 5 or other appropriate person as determined by the secretary of 6 7 corrections, who were physically present at the penitentiary of New Mexico at the beginning of the riot and who were involved 8 9 in and experienced any aspect of the riot; (2) provide those correctional officers 10 identified or personal representatives or other appropriate 11

12 persons with notice of their potential eligibility for 13 compensation as provided in this section; and

(3) create an application process and form
that shall:

16 (a) require information necessary to
17 establish the correctional officer's identity and the officer's
18 presence at the penitentiary of New Mexico during the riot;
19 (b) provide details of any compensation
20 that the correctional officer or the officer's estate received
21 from the officer's involvement in and experience during the
22 riot;

(c) create a rebuttable presumption of posttraumatic stress disorder as a result of the officer's involvement and experience during the riot;

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1 (d) set a reasonable deadline, but no 2 later than June 30, 2017, for a correctional officer or other 3 person receiving notice of potential eligibility for compensation to submit an application to the secretary of 4 5 corrections for compensation pursuant to this section; establish a method of independent 6 (e) 7 review of the rebuttable presumption of posttraumatic stress disorder diagnosis to confirm eligibility for compensation if 8 9 the secretary of corrections determines a review is necessary; require a waiver and release from 10 (f) further claims against the state pursuant to this section; and 11 12 (g) provide for an informal hearing at which a correctional officer applicant, a personal 13 14 representative or other appropriate person may be represented by counsel or other person of the applicant's choice if the 15 secretary of corrections decides that more information from the 16 applicant is needed before the secretary can make a decision on 17 18 the application. If the secretary of corrections decides that the 19 C. 20

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application substantiates that the correctional officer or the officer's estate has successfully completed an application pursuant to this section, the secretary shall pay to the correctional officer, a personal representative or other appropriate person one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.--One million five hundred .203074.1

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	1	thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) is appropriated from the general
	2	fund to the corrections department for expenditure in fiscal
	3	years 2017 and 2018 to carry out the purposes of Section 1 of
	4	this act; provided that no more than one hundred thousand
	5	dollars (\$100,000) shall be used for administration. Any
	6	unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of
	7	fiscal year 2018 shall revert to the general fund.
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
