16	SECTION 1. Section 30-7-16 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1981,
17	Chapter 225, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"30-7-16. FIREARMS OR DESTRUCTIVE DEVICESRECEIPT,
19	TRANSPORTATION OR POSSESSION BY A FELON OR VIOLENT
20	<u>MISDEMEANANT</u> PENALTY
21	A. It is unlawful for a felon <u>or a violent</u>
22	misdemeanant to receive, transport or possess any firearm or
23	destructive device in this state.

As used in this section: 3 C. "destructive device" means: 4 (1)(a) any explosive, incendiary or poison 5 1) bomb; 2) grenade; 3) rocket having a propellant charge 6 gas: 7 of more than four ounces; 4) missile having an explosive or 8 incendiary charge of more than one-fourth ounce; 5) mine; or 6) 9 similar device; (b) any type of weapon by whatever name 10

known that will, or that may be readily converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive or other propellant, the barrel or barrels of which have a bore of more than onehalf inch in diameter, except a shotgun or shotgun shell that is generally recognized as particularly suitable for sporting purposes; and

(c) any combination of parts either designed or intended for use in converting any device into a destructive device as defined in this paragraph and from which a destructive device may be readily assembled.

The term "destructive device" does not include any device that is neither designed nor redesigned for use as a weapon or any device, although originally designed for use as a weapon, that is redesigned for use as a signaling, pyrotechnic, line throwing, safety or similar device;
