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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

2 SECTION 1. Section 66-1-4.4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1990, 3 Chapter 120, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read: "66-1-4.4. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Motor Vehicle 4 5 Code: "day" means calendar day, unless otherwise 6 Α. 7 provided in the Motor Vehicle Code; "dealer", except as specifically excluded, means 8 Β. any person who sells or solicits or advertises the sale of new 9 or used motor vehicles, manufactured homes or trailers subject 10 to registration in this state; "dealer" does not include: 11 12 (1)receivers, trustees, administrators, executors, guardians or other persons appointed by or acting 13 under judgment, decree or order of any court; 14 (2) public officers while performing their 15 duties as such officers; 16 persons making casual sales of their own (3) 17 vehicles; 18 (4) finance companies, banks and other lending 19 institutions making sales of repossessed vehicles; or 20 (5) licensed brokers under the Manufactured 21 Housing Act who, for a fee, commission or other valuable 22 consideration, engage in brokerage activities related to the 23 sale, exchange or lease purchase of pre-owned manufactured 24 homes on a site installed for a consumer; 25 .202324.11

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C. "declared gross weight" means the maximum gross vehicle weight or gross combination vehicle weight at which a vehicle or combination will be operated during the registration period, as declared by the registrant for registration and fee purposes; the vehicle or combination shall have only one declared gross weight for all operating considerations;

D. "department" means the taxation and revenue department, the secretary of taxation and revenue or any employee of the department exercising authority lawfully delegated to that employee by the secretary;

E. "designated accessible parking space for persons with significant mobility limitation" means any space, including an access aisle, that is marked and reserved for the parking of a passenger vehicle that carries registration plates or a parking placard with the international symbol of access issued in accordance with Section 66-3-16 NMSA 1978 and that is designated by a conspicuously posted sign bearing the international symbol of access and, if the parking space is paved, by a clearly visible depiction of this symbol painted in blue on the pavement of the space;

F. "director" means the secretary;

G. "disqualification" means a prohibition against driving a commercial motor vehicle;

H. "distinguishing number" means the number assigned by the department to a vehicle whose identifying .202324.11 - 3 -

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number has been destroyed or obliterated or the number assigned
 by the department to a vehicle that has never had an
 identifying number;

I. "distributor" means a person who distributes or
sells new or used motor vehicles to dealers and who is not a
manufacturer;

J. "division", without further specification, "division of motor vehicles" or "motor vehicle division" means the department;

K. "driver" means every person who drives or is in actual physical control of a motor vehicle, including a motorcycle, upon a highway, who is exercising control over or steering a vehicle being towed by a motor vehicle or who operates or is in actual physical control of an off-highway motor vehicle;

L. "driver's license" means a license or a class of license <u>that meets federal requirements to be accepted by</u> <u>federal agencies for official federal purposes</u> issued by a state or other jurisdiction to an individual that authorizes the individual to drive a motor vehicle; [and]

M. "driveaway-towaway operation" means an operation in which any motor vehicle, new or used, is the item being transported when one set or more of wheels of any such motor vehicle is on the roadway during the course of transportation, whether or not the motor vehicle furnishes the motive power; .202324.11

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1 and "driving privilege card" means a card not 2 Ν. intended to be accepted by federal agencies for official 3 federal purposes issued or recognized under the laws of New 4 Mexico pertaining to the authorization of persons to operate 5 motor vehicles." 6 7 SECTION 2. Section 66-1-4.10 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1990, 8 Chapter 120, Section 11) is amended to read: 9 "66-1-4.10.  $[\underline{E}.]$ $\underline{F}.$ "local authorities" means every county, municipality and any local board or body having authority to enact laws relating to traffic under the constitution and laws of this state."

SECTION 3. Section 66-5-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978, Chapter 35, Section 231, as amended) is amended to read:

"66-5-9. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE, TEMPORARY LICENSE, PROVISIONAL LICENSE, [OR] INSTRUCTION PERMIT <u>OR DRIVING</u> <u>PRIVILEGE CARD OR RENEWAL.--</u>

A. An application for an instruction permit, provisional license, [or] driver's license <u>or driving privilege</u> <u>card or a renewal of an instruction permit, provisional</u> <u>license, driver's license or driving privilege card</u> shall be made upon a form furnished by the department. An application shall be accompanied by the proper fee. For permits, provisional licenses, [or] driver's licenses <u>or driving</u> <u>privilege cards</u> other than those issued pursuant to the New Mexico Commercial Driver's License Act, submission of a complete application with payment of the fee entitles the .202324.11

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applicant to not more than three attempts to pass the examination within a period of six months from the date of application.

An application [shall contain the full name, 4 Β. social security number or individual tax identification number] 5 for a driving privilege card shall contain the applicant's full 6 7 name. An application for a driver's license shall contain the applicant's full legal name. All applications for licenses 8 shall contain the applicant's date of birth; sex; and current 9 New Mexico residence address [of the applicant] and shall 10 briefly describe the applicant and indicate whether the 11 12 applicant has previously been licensed as a driver and, if so, when and by what state or country and whether any such license 13 has ever been suspended or revoked or whether an application 14 has ever been refused and, if so, the date of and reason for 15 the suspension, revocation or refusal. [For foreign nationals 16 applying for driver's licenses, the secretary shall accept the 17 individual taxpayer identification number as a substitute for a 18 19 social security number regardless of immigration status.] The 20 secretary [is authorized to] shall establish by regulation [other] documents that may be accepted as [a substitute for a 21 social security number or an individual tax identification 22 number] evidence of the residency of the applicant. A person 23 applying for or renewing a driver's license shall provide 24 documentation required by the federal government of the 25

3	For an applicant for a driver's license or a renewal of a
4	driver's license, the department shall verify the applicant's
5	lawful status and social security number, if applicable,
6	through a method approved by the federal government.
7	C. A person with lawful status may apply for a
8	driver's license or a driving privilege card.
9	D. An applicant shall indicate whether the
10	applicant is applying for a driver's license or a driving
11	privilege card. The department shall issue a driving privilege
12	<u>card to an applicant who is otherwise eligible for a driver's</u>
13	license but who does not provide proof of lawful status. An
14	applicant who does not provide proof of lawful status shall
15	only apply for a driving privilege card. Except as otherwise
16	provided in the Motor Vehicle Code, the department may treat
17	driving privilege cards as driver's licenses.
18	E. An application by a foreign national with lawful
19	status for a driver's license shall contain the unique
20	identifying number and expiration date, if applicable, of the
21	<u>foreign national's valid passport, valid visa, employment</u>
22	authorization card issued under the applicant's approved
23	deferred action status or other arrival-departure record or
24	document issued by the federal government that conveys lawful
25	status. The department may issue to an eligible foreign
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1	national applicant a driver's license that is valid for a
2	period not to exceed the duration of the applicant's lawful
3	status; provided that if that date cannot be determined by the
4	department and the applicant is not a legal permanent resident,
5	the license shall expire one year after the effective date of
6	the license.
7	F. An application for a driving privilege card
8	shall include proof of the applicant's identity and age as
9	shown by:
10	(1) a social security number or an individual
11	tax identification number;
12	(2) a passport from the applicant's country of
13	citizenship or an identification card, issued by the consulate
14	of Mexico in Albuquerque, New Mexico, the consulate general of
15	Mexico in El Paso, Texas, or such other foreign consulate with
16	which the department has established a reliable method of
17	verifying the authenticity of the identification card;
18	(3) a valid New Mexico license or
19	identification card; or
20	(4) a document that the secretary has
21	authorized.
22	$[G_{\bullet}]$ G. An applicant shall indicate whether the
23	applicant has been convicted of driving while under the
24	influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs in this state or in
25	any other jurisdiction. Failure to disclose any such
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1 conviction prevents the issuance of a driver's license, driving 2 privilege card, provisional license, temporary license or 3 instruction permit for a period of one year if the failure to disclose is discovered by the department prior to issuance. 4 If 5 the nondisclosure is discovered by the department subsequent to issuance, the department shall revoke the driver's license, 6 7 driving privilege card, provisional license, temporary license or instruction permit for a period of one year. Intentional 8 9 and willful failure to disclose, as required in this subsection, is a misdemeanor. 10

[D.] <u>H.</u> An applicant under eighteen years of age who is making an application for a first New Mexico driver's license <u>or driving privilege card</u> shall submit evidence that the applicant has:

(1) successfully completed a driver education course approved by the bureau that included a DWI prevention and education component. The bureau may accept verification of driver education course completion from another state if the driver education course substantially meets the requirements of the bureau for a course offered in New Mexico;

(2) had a provisional license for at least the twelve-month period immediately preceding the date of the application for the driver's license <u>or driving privilege card</u>; provided that thirty days shall be added to the twelve-month period for each adjudication or conviction of a traffic .202324.11

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violation committed during the time the person was driving with a provisional license;

(3) complied with restrictions on that license;

(4) not been cited for a traffic violationthat is pending at the time of application; and

(5) not been adjudicated for an offense involving the use of alcohol or drugs during the twelve-month period immediately preceding the date of the application for the driver's license <u>or driving privilege card</u> and that there are no pending adjudications alleging an offense involving the use of alcohol or drugs at the time of application.

[E.] <u>I.</u> An applicant eighteen years of age or over, but under twenty-five years of age, who is making an application to be granted a first New Mexico driver's license <u>or driving privilege card</u> shall submit evidence with the application that the applicant has successfully completed a bureau-approved DWI prevention and education program.

[F.] J. An applicant twenty-five years of age or over who has been convicted of driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs and who is making an application to be granted a first New Mexico driver's license <u>or driving</u> <u>privilege card</u> shall submit evidence with the application that the applicant has successfully completed a bureau-approved DWI prevention and education program.

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1 $[G_{\cdot}]$ <u>K</u>. Whenever an application is received from a 2 person previously licensed in another jurisdiction, the 3 department may request a copy of the driver's record from the other jurisdiction. When received, the driver's record may 4 become a part of the driver's record in this state with the 5 same effect as though entered on the driver's record in this 6 7 state in the original instance. 8 [H.] L. Whenever the department receives a request 9 for a driver's record from another licensing jurisdiction, the record shall be forwarded without charge. 10 [1.] M. This section does not apply to [driver's] 11 12 licenses issued pursuant to the New Mexico Commercial Driver's License Act." 13 14 SECTION 4. Section 66-5-15 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978, Chapter 35, Section 237, as amended) is amended to read: 15 "66-5-15. LICENSES ISSUED TO APPLICANTS .--16 The department shall, upon payment of the 17 Α. required fee, issue to every qualified applicant a [driver's] 18 19 license as applied for. [The license] A driving privilege card 20 shall bear the applicant's full name. A driver's license shall bear the applicant's full legal name. All licenses shall bear 21 the [full name] applicant's date of birth; sex; current New 22 Mexico [physical or mailing] residence address; [a] full-face 23 or front-view digital photograph; [of the license holder and] a 24 unique license number; a date of issuance; an expiration date; 25 .202324.11

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a brief description of the licensee; and the signature of the licensee. A license shall not be valid unless it bears the signature of the licensee.

<u>B. The department shall ensure that driver's</u> <u>licenses and driving privilege cards are distinguishable in</u> <u>color and design.</u>

C. A driver's license issued to a foreign national
who fails to prove that the foreign national's lawful status
will not expire prior to the date on which the license applied
for would expire but for the person being a foreign national
shall clearly indicate on its face and in the machine readable
zone that it is temporary and shall bear the word "TEMPORARY".

D. A driving privilege card shall bear the statement: "NOT FOR FEDERAL PURPOSES."."

SECTION 5. Section 66-5-19 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978, Chapter 35, Section 241, as amended) is amended to read: "66-5-19. RESTRICTED LICENSES.--

A. The division, upon issuing a [driver's license or a provisional] license, may, whenever good cause appears, impose restrictions, including the shortening of the licensure period suitable to the licensee's driving ability with respect to the type of or special mechanical control devices required on a motor vehicle that the licensee may operate or such other restrictions applicable to the licensee as the division determines to be appropriate to ensure the safe operation of a .202324.11

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1 motor vehicle by the licensee.

B. At age [seventy-five] seventy-nine and thereafter, the applicant shall renew the applicant's license on a yearly basis at no cost to the applicant.

5 C. The division may either issue a special
6 restricted license or may set forth such restrictions upon the
7 usual license form.

8 D. The division may issue a restricted license or a 9 restricted provisional license for driving during daylight hours only to some visually impaired persons who fail the usual 10 eyesight test. The health standards advisory board created 11 12 pursuant to the provisions of Section 66-5-6 NMSA 1978 shall evaluate the extent of the visual impairment and the 13 impairment's effect on the driving ability of the applicant 14 and, based on the board's recommendations, the director may 15 issue a restricted license under the following conditions: 16

(1) the applicant has no record of moving violations;

(2) the necessity of the license is shown to the satisfaction of the director; and

(3) the applicant satisfies the provisions of Section 66-5-206 NMSA 1978 relating to proof of financial responsibility.

E. The division may, upon receiving satisfactory evidence of any violation of the restrictions of the license, .202324.11

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suspend the license, but the licensee is entitled to a hearing as upon a suspension under Sections 66-5-1.1 through 66-5-47 NMSA 1978 and as provided in the Administrative Hearings Office Act.

F. It is a misdemeanor for any person to operate a motor vehicle in any manner in violation of the restrictions imposed in a restricted license issued to the person."

SECTION 6. Section 66-5-21 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978, Chapter 35, Section 243, as amended by Laws 2010, Chapter 42, Section 2 and by Laws 2010, Chapter 70, Section 2) is amended to read:

"66-5-21. EXPIRATION OF LICENSE--<u>LIMITED ISSUANCE</u> <u>PERIOD</u>--FOUR-YEAR ISSUANCE PERIOD--EIGHT-YEAR ISSUANCE PERIOD--RENEWAL.--

A. Except as provided in [Subsection B or D] Subsections B through G of this section, Section 66-5-19 NMSA 1978 and Section 66-5-67 NMSA 1978, all [driver's] licenses shall be issued for a period of four years, and each license shall expire thirty days after the applicant's birthday in the fourth year after the effective date of the license or shall expire thirty days after the applicant's [seventy-fifth] seventy-ninth birthday. A license issued pursuant to Section 66-5-19 NMSA 1978 shall expire thirty days after the applicant's birthday in the year in which the license expires; provided that a license shall not be valid for a period of more .202324.11

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1 than eight years. Each license is renewable within ninety days 2 prior to its expiration or at an earlier date approved by the department. The fee for the license shall be as provided in 3 Section 66-5-44 NMSA 1978. The department may provide for 4 5 renewal by mail or telephonic or electronic means of a [driver's] license issued pursuant to the provisions of this 6 7 subsection, pursuant to regulations adopted by the department that ensure adequate security measures to safeguard personal 8 9 information that is obtained in the issuance of a [driver's] license, except the department shall not renew by mail or 10 telephonic or electronic means a license if prohibited by 11 12 federal law. The department may require an examination upon renewal of the [driver's] license. 13

Β. At the option of an applicant, a driver's license may be issued for a period of eight years, provided that the applicant:

pays the amount required for a driver's (1)license issued for a term of eight years;

otherwise qualifies for a four-year (2) driver's license; and

(3) will not reach the age of [seventy-five] seventy-nine during the last four years of the eight-year license period or reach the age of twenty-one during any year within the term of the license.

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1 provisions of Subsection B of this section shall expire [thirty 2 days after the applicant's birthday in the eighth year] eight years after the effective date of the license. 3 A driver's license issued prior to an 4 D. 5 applicant's twenty-first birthday shall expire thirty days after the applicant's twenty-first birthday. A driver's 6 7 license issued prior to an applicant's twenty-first birthday 8 may be issued for a period of up to five years. 9 E.
