BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 61-14B-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996, Chapter 57, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:

"61-14B-5. SCOPE OF PRACTICE--AUDIOLOGISTS.--The scope of practice for audiologists shall include:

A. the rendering or offering to render 13 professional services, including nonmedical diagnosis, 14 15 prevention, identification, evaluation, consultation, counseling, habilitation, rehabilitation and instruction on 16 17 and prognostication of individuals having or suspected of having disorders of hearing, balance or central auditory 18 processing and including, at the time of the initial 19 20 examination for possible sale and fitting of a hearing aid if a hearing loss is determined, informing each prospective 21 purchaser about hearing aid options that can provide a direct 22 connection between the hearing aid and assistive listening 23 24 systems that are compliant with the latest standards for accessible design adopted by the United States department of 25 HB 70
