## A MEMORIAL

2 REQUESTING THE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES PLANNING COUNCIL 3 AND THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO CENTER FOR DEVELOPMENT AND DISABILITY TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO CONDUCT A NEEDS 4 5 ASSESSMENT AND REPORT ON WAYS TO IMPROVE THE SYSTEM OF SCHOOL-TO-WORK TRANSITION FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES IN 6 NEW MEXICO.

WHEREAS, a public education department post-school outcome survey in 2012 reported that employment was declining for individuals with any disability, but in particular for those individuals reporting a developmental disability; and

WHEREAS, national data from the United States department of labor reflects that more than seventy percent of students with disabilities leave high school each year without employment prospects; and

WHEREAS, diminished employment prospects set a lifetime pattern and expectation of dependence on public assistance, poverty, inactivity and segregation from the community; and

WHEREAS, the federal Workforce Innovation and 20 Opportunity Act, which took effect on July 1, 2015, requires 21 that states engage in a unified strategic planning process 22 and collaborate to improve school-to-work transition outcomes 23 for students with disabilities; and 24

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WHEREAS, the act provides a promising opportunity for SM 25

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New Mexico youth with disabilities; and

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WHEREAS, for New Mexico to successfully comply with the new Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act mandates, it is important for state and local agencies serving youth with disabilities to work cooperatively and to leverage their resources; and

WHEREAS, successful outcomes must engage local community organizations, advocacy groups and youth with disabilities and their families in planning and education; and

WHEREAS, the creation of a task force to include young adults with disabilities and state, local and community stakeholders would facilitate compliance with the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the developmental disabilities planning council and the university of New Mexico center for development and disability be requested to convene a task force to conduct a needs assessment and report on ways to improve the system of school-to-work transition of students with disabilities in New Mexico; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be requested to make formal recommendations for changes to existing policies, programs or regulatory provisions that would:

A. address barriers to effective school-to-worktransition for youth with disabilities;

SM 25 Page 2 B. result in more effective services for youth with disabilities as they make the transition from school to work;

C. improve the efficiency of the school-to-work transition process for students with disabilities;

D. increase the knowledge of students with disabilities and their family members on transition from school-to-work options; and

9 E. maximize outcomes, including lifelong
10 opportunities for persons with disabilities to obtain
11 competitive integrated employment; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be composed 12 of one or more young adults with disabilities who have 13 transitioned from high school to adult life and their family 14 members; and representatives of the developmental 15 disabilities planning council, the university of New Mexico 16 center for development and disability, parents reaching out, 17 the vocational rehabilitation division of the public 18 education department, the public education department, the 19 developmental disabilities supports division of the 20 department of health, the workforce solutions department, 21 youth development inc., advocacy organizations, centers for 22 independent living, the governor's commission on disability 23 and disability rights New Mexico; and 24

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force report its
