SUMMARY

Synopsis of HWMC Amendment

The House Ways & Means Committee amendment reduces the Rio Rancho Senior Center in Sandoval County from \$11.4 million to \$3.4 million and adds a new project in the amount of \$8 million for the Health Science Center West education building in Rio Rancho in Sandoval County.

Synopsis of SFC Substitute

Senate Finance Committee Substitute for Senate Bill 122 authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds (GOB) totaling \$186.3 million including an estimated \$1.1 million for the cost of bond issuance. The bill proposes four bond issues including capital expenditures for senior citizen facilities statewide (\$23.2 million); for library resource acquisitions (\$10 million); for higher education facilities, special school and tribal school capital improvements and acquisitions (\$134.0 million); and for public safety issues (\$18 million). (*See Attachments*) The bill contains an emergency clause.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

According to revenue estimators, general obligation bond (GOB) capacity is approximately \$185.1 million, or approximately 0.33 percent of net taxable value of property. Authorizing no more than the stated capacity maintains a flat mil levy. The authorization of approximately \$186.2 million contained in this bill, including nearly \$1 million for the cost of issuance of the bonds, is a non-recurring expense to GOB capacity.

Issuance and sale of general obligation bonds requires approval by the electorate in the 2016 November general election. General obligation bonds are payable from ad valorem (property) taxes levied on all property in the state subject to property taxation. The bonds are backed by the full faith and credit of the state.

General obligation bonds are approved for issuance by the State Board of Finance in January or February 2017 following the general election. If ratified by the voters, funds authorized in this bill will be available to the recipients in the spring of 2017.

The state agencies and state institutions to which money has been appropriated in this bill shall be responsible for monitoring the projects funded in the bill to ensure compliance with the laws and Constitution of New Mexico and shall cause to be reverted any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the earlier of the third full fiscal year after issuance of the bonds or the termination or completion of the specific project. Reverted funds shall be deposited in the debt service fund established by the state treasurer for the purpose of paying the principal and interest on the state's general obligation bonds.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The Aging and Long Term Services Department (ALTSD) received capital outlay requests totaling \$40.5 million from senior centers statewide. ALTSD and area agencies on aging rated 119 projects statewide by applying criteria and allocating points to prioritize projects in five categories: code compliance, meals and other equipment, renovations, vehicles and construction and major additions statewide.

The New Mexico Library Association requested \$17.5 million on behalf of public libraries, public school libraries, academic libraries, and tribal public libraries. Public and public school libraries and tribal libraries will allocate funds based on population and full-time-equivalent student enrollment. New Mexico colleges and universities will use the funds toward electronic resources (academic journals, electronic reference books, electronic books, educational films, etc.) to provide resources to students regardless of institution or course work, particularly in rural areas.

Institutions of higher education, special schools, and tribal schools requested \$253.2 million for capital needs statewide. The bill proposes approximately \$134 million for infrastructure projects at the institutions of higher education. Approximately, 72 percent of the total dollar amount listed within this bill is recommended for higher education institutions, special schools, and tribal schools. The largest projects include the Golden Student Success Center at Eastern New Mexico University, Rodgers administration at New Highlands University, Jones Hall at New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology, Dan W. Williams Hall at New Mexico State University, the

physics and astronomy building at the University of New Mexico, Harlan hall at Western New Mexico University, and the Max Salazar hall at Central New Mexico Community College.

The Department of Public Safety requested funding to plan and design a new evidence center and crime lab in Santa Fe. The evidence and records are currently housed in five different facilities, and the crime laboratory is at a crisis point with a lack of space and at high risk for cross-contamination. The bill contains \$7 million to address phase 1 of the total construction cost. House Bill 219 contains \$500,000 for the plan and design of the proposed facility.

The Department of Information Technology requested funding for public safety radio communications. The project will stabilize and modernize public safety communications to meet the current and future operability and interoperability needs of public safety users statewide. The bill contains \$5 million for this purpose.

The Department of Military Affairs requested funding to plan, design, and construct the Las Cruces National Guard Readiness Center in Dona Ana County. According to the department, the funds will be used to match more than \$9.3 million in federal funds. The bill proposes \$5 million for the purpose of matching the federal funds. The bill also contains \$2 million for improvements and repairs to state armories statewide.

RELATIONSHIP

House Bill 219 provides \$500,000 to plan and design a new state police crime lab and evidence and records facility proposed in this bill.

TECHNICAL ISSUES

Technical and language changes proposed by the Higher Education Department and the Department of Finance Administration have been incorporated into the bill.

OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

The HED held hearings in Santa Fe, Albuquerque, Socorro, Las Cruces, and Roswell. All secondary institutions, the three special schools, Dine College, the Institute of American Indian Arts, Navajo Technical College, and Southwestern Indian Polytechnic Institute presented their capital requests for infrastructure projects statewide.

The proposed projects in the bill for consideration by the full Legislature were based on the following criteria:

- Student, faculty, and public safety
- Project completion
- Funding from other sources
- Project readiness
- Facility condition index
- Instructional & General (I&G) and space utilization
- Full-time student enrollment trends
- Programmatic use of building
- Energy-efficiency standards

WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

If SB 122 is not enacted, or voters do not ratify the bill in the 2016 November general election, the cost for capital improvements will increase significantly and facilities will continue to deteriorate.
