18	WHEREAS, Adolph enlisted in the United States air force at
19	age seventeen and, while enlisted, joined the track and field
20	team and traveled the world; and
21	WHEREAS, upon completion of his military service, Adolph
22	accepted a track scholarship from the university of New Mexico;

24	WHEREAS, in 1961, Adolph became the national collegiate
25	athletic association champion in the four-hundred-forty-yard

WHEREAS, Adolph, as a university of New Mexico senior, set a world record in the four-hundred-forty-yard dash of fortyfour and nine-tenths seconds at the 1963 western athletic conference championship; and

WHEREAS, a devoted educator, Adolph worked in the Denver public schools for over thirty years, serving as a student adviser, track and football coach and assistant principal; and

WHEREAS, Adolph also served as an associate dean of the university of New Mexico athletic department; and

WHEREAS, Adolph was inducted into the New Mexico sports hall of fame and the university of New Mexico alumni lettermen's association hall of honor and was honored with a living legend award by the university of New Mexico black alumni chapter; and

WHEREAS, Adolph is survived by his wife of thirty-seven years, Carolyn Plummer; his children, Kimberly, Kevin and Cheryl; and his granddaughter, Galen;
