16	WHEREAS, in the past, New Mexico pre-kindergarten state
17	funds and programs have displaced and supplanted federal
18	funding, resulting in the reversion of substantial funding back
19	to the federal government; and
20	WHEREAS, the reversion of these funds resulted in the
21	under-enrollment at various New Mexico head start and child
22	care programs around the state; and
23	WHEREAS, under-enrollment in New Mexico head start
24	programs may result in potential, permanent reversion of funds
25	to the federal government; and

WHEREAS, in the past, limited state dollars have been unevenly allocated, with some communities with early childhood services for four-year-olds receiving disproportionately more funding than other communities; and

WHEREAS, the disproportionate funding has led to financial stress and closure of some private and nonprofit programs; and

WHEREAS, when child care programs close, some services, such as infant and toddler services, are lost; and

WHEREAS, increased communication, collaboration and coordination among the children, youth and families department, the public education department and early childhood service providers would help working parents or parents attending school to obtain better information on access to the variety of services available to families with children from birth through five years old; and

WHEREAS, such collaboration and coordination has the potential to maximize state resources and to prevent duplication of efforts; and

WHEREAS, combined funding sources and services could strengthen and expand much-needed services for families;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the children, youth and families department and the public education department be requested to convene a task force to study how to increase communication, coordination and collaboration among early childhood service providers; and
