Bill Summary

Senate Bill 10 (SB10) provides for the secretary of public education to reduce the school district and charter school state equalization guarantee (SEG) distributions (formula funding) in an amount equal to \$25 million as a credit for excess fiscal year 2016 operational fund cash balances. The bill excludes school districts that received emergency supplemental funding in FY16 or FY17 from the reduction. The reduction to each non-emergency supplemental school district and charter school is in proportion to their final funded FY16 student enrollment (MEM).

The bill has an emergency clause.

Fiscal Impact

Senate Bill 10 will result in a one-time (nonrecurring) reduction in school district and charter school SEG distributions in the amount of \$25 million in FY17. The credit taken is independent of a school district's or charter school's actual budgeted cash balance, resulting in a larger fiscal impact on school districts and charter schools with low cash balances and high student membership. In the alternative, school districts and charter schools with high cash balances and low student membership see a smaller fiscal impact.

Fifteen school districts and charter schools that are receiving emergency supplemental funding (FY16 and FY17) are explicitly excluded from the reductions provided for in the bill.

Because the reduction is non-recurring, it will not impact a school district's or charter school's program cost in FY17. Because of this, it should not impact the state's special education maintenance of effort (MOE) requirements pursuant to Part B of the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

While the reduction does not impact a school district's or charter school's program cost, it may have implications related to two education funding sufficiency lawsuits. Generally, these lawsuits allege New Mexico failed to provide a uniform system of free public schools for the sufficient education of all the children of school age as mandated by the New Mexico Constitution. In particular, these lawsuits allege low student performance is associated with insufficient funding for schools.

At a Glance

- SB 10 will result in an increase of \$25 million in nonrecurring revenue to the general fund in FY17.
- The reduction will not impact each school district's or charter school's program cost and therefore should not impact federal special education maintenance of effort requirements for FY17.
- The reduction is independent of school district or charter school fiscal year 2016 operational fund cash balances.
- Each school district and charter school's portion of the reduction will be equivalent to their proportion of student membership in FY16.

Substantive Issues

The bill takes credit for \$25 million of \$252 million in fiscal year 2016 operational fund cash balances of school districts and charter schools by reducing each school district's and charter school's FY17 SEG distribution. See Attachment. The reduction is a nonrecurring reduction that will not impact each school district's or charter school's program cost.

The bill requires PED to notify each school district and charter school of the amount of their reduction by November 1, 2016 and requires PED to reduce the SEG distributions from November 2016 through June 2017 in equal amounts.

Calculation of the reduction is to be based on the following:

- \$25 million divided by the total final funded student membership in FY16; and
- The quotient of the above calculation multiplied by an individual school district's or charter school's final funded membership in FY16.

Background

Prior to 2003, school districts were allowed to retain actual cash balances. In 2003, \$11.0 million from school district cash balances statewide was used as a credit in the calculation of the SEG for FY04. Additionally, at that time, Section 22-8-41 NMSA 1978 was amended to allow the state to take credit for a portion of a school district's or charter school's operational cash balance in excess of a percentage of each school district's or charter school's program cost. The section was amended several times between 2003 and 2007 to increase the allowable percentage of cash balance, until the limitation was removed by Laws 2011, Chapter 39. As of 2011, school districts and charter schools have been allowed to carry forward all cash balances from the previous year. Unaudited cash balances budgeted by school districts and charter schools totaled \$252.5 million at the end of FY16. This is an increase of \$42.9 million, or 20.5 percent since FY15 year end.
