Honorable Speaker Egolf and Members of the House:

Pursuant to the Constitution of the State of New Mexico, Article IV, Section 22, I hereby VETO and return HOUSE EDUCATION COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL 105 enacted by the Fifty-Third Legislature, First Session, 2017.

House Bill 105 proposes a formal application process for teachers to use innovative teaching methods in the classroom. This bill would create an obstacle for teachers to use innovation to reach every one of their students, something our best and most effective teachers already do every day as part of their work.

Further, this bill would fail to properly consider student achievement in their evaluation. Teachers who effectively innovate in the classroom should reap the rewards of their success, and teachers who need to improve should get feedback relevant to their students' performance.

For these reasons, I hereby veto House Bill 105.
