20	SECTION 2. A new section of the Audit Act is enacted to

22	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] OBSTRUCTION OF A STATE AUDIT
23	A. Obstruction of a state audit consists of a
24	person who, with the intent to deceive, mislead or interfere,
25	obstructs the performance of an audit, special audit,

1	examination or investigation being conducted pursuant to the
2	Audit Act by:
3	(1) destroying, concealing or altering any
4	document or record;
5	(2) making or causing to be made a false or
6	misleading report; or
7	(3) impeding the state auditor, personnel of
8	the state auditor's office or independent auditors approved by
9	the state auditor.
10	B. Whoever commits obstruction of a state audit is
11	guilty of a fourth degree felony and shall be sentenced in
12	accordance with the provisions of Section 31-18-15 NMSA 1978."
13	SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
14	provisions of this act is July 1, 2017.
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
