"29-4A-2. FINDINGS--PURPOSE.--The legislature finds that 2 peace officers throughout the state risk their lives daily to protect the [citizens] <u>residents</u> of New Mexico. The legislature further finds that when peace officers are killed in the line of duty, their immediate families can suffer grievously, both emotionally and economically. To recognize 7 the substantial public safety benefits conferred by peace officers and in consideration of the sacrifices undertaken by 8 these officers and their families for the [citizens] residents of New Mexico, it is the purpose of the Peace Officers' 10 Survivors Supplemental Benefits Act to ensure that certain 12 supplemental death benefits accrue to the spouse and surviving children or to the parents, if there are no surviving children or spouse, of a peace officer killed in the line of duty."

SECTION 3. Section 29-4A-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, Chapter 59, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:

"29-4A-3. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Peace Officers' [New Mexico Mounted Patrol Members' and Reserve Police Officers'] Survivors Supplemental Benefits Act:

Α. "fund" means the peace officers' [New Mexico mounted patrol members' and reserve police officers'] survivors fund;

[B. "New Mexico mounted patrol" means units or troops officered and manned to assist with law enforcement pursuant to the provisions of Sections 29-6-1 and 29-6-4 NMSA .204310.2SA

"peace officer" means: 3 (1) any full-time salaried and commissioned or 4 certified law enforcement officer of a police or sheriff's 5 department [or] that is part of or administered by the state or 6 7 any political subdivision of the state; (2) a conservation officer of the department 8 of game and fish as used in Chapter 17 NMSA 1978 that is part 9 of or administered by the state or any political subdivision of 10 the state; 11 12 (3) a corrections officer of the corrections department or jailers as used in Chapter 33 NMSA 1978 that is 13 part of or administered by the state or any political 14 subdivision of the state; 15 (4) a member of a New Mexico mounted patrol 16 unit or troop officered and staffed to assist with law 17 enforcement pursuant to the provisions of Sections 29-6-1 and 18 29-6-4 NMSA 1978, Subsection A of Section 29-6-5 NMSA 1978 and 19 20 Section 29-6-6 NMSA 1978; and [D.] (5) a reserve police officer [means] who 21 is a volunteer or a temporary or part-time employee of a state 22 or local law enforcement agency who is accepted by that agency 23 as a reserve law enforcement officer after receiving a 24 background check and training as needed by that agency and who 25

[E.] <u>C.</u> "secretary" means the secretary of public safety."

SECTION 4. Section 29-4A-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, Chapter 59, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:

"29-4A-4. FUND CREATED.--The "peace officers' [New Mexico mounted patrol members' and reserve police officers'] survivors fund" is created in the state treasury and shall be administered by the department of public safety. The fund shall consist of all gifts, donations and bequests of money to the fund as well as any appropriations made to the fund. Earnings from investment of the fund shall be credited to the fund. Money in the fund is appropriated to the department of public safety for the purpose of paying death benefits pursuant to the Peace Officers' [New Mexico Mounted Patrol Members' and Reserve Police Officers'] Survivors Supplemental Benefits Act and shall be paid out only upon warrants issued by the secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the secretary of public safety. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining in the fund at the end of any fiscal year shall not revert."

SECTION 5. Section 29-4A-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, Chapter 59, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:

"29-4A-5. PEACE OFFICERS' [NEW MEXICO MOUNTED PATROL MEMBERS' AND RESERVE POLICE OFFICERS'] SURVIVORS SUPPLEMENTAL .204310.2SA

DEATH BENEFITS--REVIEW COMMITTEE--DETERMINATION--PAYMENT.--

A. There is created the "peace officers' [New Mexico mounted patrol members' and reserve police officers'] survivors supplemental death benefits review committee". The committee shall consist of the attorney general, the chief of the New Mexico state police, <u>the secretary of corrections</u> and the state president of the fraternal order of police or their designees.

9 Β. The peace officers' [New Mexico mounted patrol members' and reserve police officers' survivors supplemental 10 death benefits review committee shall determine whether a peace 11 12 officer [New Mexico mounted patrol member or reserve police officer] has been killed in the line of duty and advise the 13 14 secretary of that determination. In addition to any other death benefits provided by law, the surviving spouse, children 15 or parents shall be paid two hundred fifty thousand dollars 16 (\$250,000) as supplemental death benefits whenever a peace 17 officer [New Mexico mounted patrol member or reserve police 18 19 officer] is killed in the line of duty. The benefits shall be 20 paid from the fund.

C. The benefits shall be paid first to the surviving spouse. If there is no surviving spouse, the benefits shall be distributed in pro rata shares to all surviving children. If there are no surviving children or spouse, benefits shall be distributed to the surviving .204310.2SA
