RELATING TO ARSON; AMENDING THE DEFINITION OF "ARSON"; CHANGING WHAT QUALIFIES AS AGGRAVATED ARSON; INCORPORATING THE COST OF FIRE SUPPRESSION INTO THE CALCULATION OF LOSS ATTRIBUTED TO ARSON.

AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 30-17-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1970, Chapter 39, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

"30-17-5. ARSON AND NEGLIGENT ARSON.--

- Arson consists of a person maliciously, [or] willfully or unlawfully starting a fire or causing an explosion or aiding or counseling in the burning of property with the purpose of destroying or damaging:
- a building, occupied structure or property (1) of another person;

- a bridge, utility line, fence [or], sign (2) or wildland; or
- any property, whether the person's own (3) property or the property of another person, to collect insurance for the loss.
- В. Whoever commits arson when the damage is two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) or less is guilty of a petty misdemeanor.
- Whoever commits arson when the damage is over two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) but not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- Whoever commits arson when the damage is over five hundred dollars (\$500) but not more than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) is guilty of a fourth degree felony.
- Whoever commits arson when the damage is over Ε. two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) but not more than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) is guilty of a third degree felony.
- Whoever commits arson when the damage is over twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) is guilty of a second degree felony.
- G. In calculating the total amount of property damage and other losses pursuant to Subsections A through F of this section, the court shall consider the cost of fire suppression.
