17	SECTION 1. Section 66-5-205 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983,
18	Chapter 318, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"66-5-205. VEHICLE MUST BE INSURED OR OWNER MUST HAVE
20	EVIDENCE OF FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITYPENALTIES
21	A. No owner shall permit the operation of an
22	uninsured motor vehicle, or a motor vehicle for which evidence
23	of financial responsibility as was affirmed to the department
24	is not currently valid, upon the streets or highways of New
25	Mexico unless the vehicle is specifically exempted from the

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provisions of the Mandatory Financial Responsibility Act.

2 Β. No person shall drive an uninsured motor vehicle, or a motor vehicle for which evidence of financial 3 responsibility as was affirmed to the department is not 4 currently valid, upon the streets or highways of New Mexico 5 unless the person is specifically exempted from the provisions 6 7 of the Mandatory Financial Responsibility Act. The department shall establish rules that require law enforcement officers to 8 accept proof of financial responsibility displayed on a 9 software application on a mobile device as evidence of 10 financial_responsibility. 11

C. For the purposes of the Mandatory Financial Responsibility Act, "uninsured motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle for which a motor vehicle insurance policy meeting the requirements of the laws of New Mexico and of the secretary, or a surety bond or evidence of a sufficient cash deposit with the state treasurer, is not in effect.

D. The provisions of the Mandatory Financial Responsibility Act requiring the deposit of evidence of financial responsibility as provided in Section 66-5-218 NMSA 1978, subject to certain exemptions, may apply with respect to persons who have been convicted of or forfeited bail for certain offenses under motor vehicle laws or who have failed to pay judgments or written settlement agreements upon causes of action arising out of ownership, maintenance or use .206205.1

3 E. Any person who violates the provisions of this
4 section is guilty of a misdemeanor as provided in Section
5 66-8-7 NMSA 1978.

F. A person charged with violating the provisions of this section shall not be convicted if the person produces, in court, evidence of financial responsibility valid at the time of issuance of the citation."

10 SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the 11 provisions of this act is July 1, 2017.

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
