AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC EDUCATION; REQUIRING COMMUNITY SCHOOLS INITIATIVES TO INCLUDE AN INDEPENDENTLY EVALUATED, EVIDENCE-BASED OR RESULTS-BASED COMMUNITY SCHOOLS MODEL DESIGNED TO IMPROVE ACADEMIC OUTCOMES, INCREASE ATTENDANCE AND STRENGTHEN BEHAVIOR FOR ALL STUDENTS; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 22-32-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2013, Chapter 16, Section 1) is amended to read:

"22-32-1. SHORT TITLE.--[This act] Chapter 22, Article 32 NMSA 1978 may be cited as the "Community Schools Act"."

**SECTION 2.** Section 22-32-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2013, Chapter 16, Section 3) is amended to read:

"22-32-3. COMMUNITY SCHOOLS INITIATIVES--SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT FUNCTIONS -- REQUIREMENTS . --

- A. A school district shall bear any administrative costs associated with the establishment and implementation of a community school within the school district.

Subject to the availability of funding, grants for community schools initiatives are available to a school district, a group of public schools or a public school that has demonstrated partnerships with any lead agency and local, private and public agencies for the purpose of establishing, operating and sustaining community schools and that meets

- A school district, a group of public schools or a public school that uses funds under this section to transform a school into a research- and evidence-based community schools initiative shall:
- use rigorous, transparent, [and] equitable and evidence-based evaluation systems to assess the effectiveness of the implementation of the community schools initiative:
- provide ongoing, high-quality professional (2) development to staff that:
- aligns with the school's instructional program;
- (b) facilitates effective teaching and learning; and
- (c) supports the implementation of school reform strategies; and
- (3) give the school sufficient operational flexibility in programming, staffing, budgeting and scheduling so that the school can fully implement a comprehensive strategy designed to focus on improving school climate, student achievement and growth in reading and mathematics, attendance, behavior, parental engagement and, for high schools, graduation rates and readiness for college or a career."
- SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION. -- Four hundred thousand dollars .205630.2

(\$400,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the public education department for expenditure in fiscal year 2018 to implement the Community Schools Act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2018 shall revert to the general fund.
