SECTION 2. Section 22-26-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983, Chapter 163, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:

"22-26-2. DEFINITION.--As used in the Public School
Buildings Act, "capital improvements" means expenditures,
including payments made with respect to lease-purchase
arrangements as defined in the Education Technology Equipment
Act but excluding any other debt service expenses, for:

- A. erecting, remodeling, making additions to, providing equipment for or furnishing public school buildings;
- B. payments made pursuant to a financing agreement entered into by a school district or a charter school for the .205139.4

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leasing of a building or other real property with an option to purchase for a price that is reduced according to payments made:

- purchasing or improving public school grounds;
- purchasing activity vehicles for transporting students to and from extracurricular school activities: provided that this authorization for expenditure does not apply to school districts with a student MEM greater than sixty thousand: [or]
- Ε. administering the projects undertaken pursuant to Subsections A and C of this section, including expenditures for facility maintenance software, project management software, project oversight and district personnel specifically related to administration of projects funded by the Public School Buildings Act; provided that expenditures pursuant to this subsection shall not exceed five percent of the total project costs; and
- F. purchasing and installing education technology improvements, including tools used in the educational process that constitute learning and administrative resources, and which may also include:
- (1) satellite, copper and fiber-optic transmission; computer and network connection devices; digital communication equipment, including voice, video and data equipment; servers; switches; portable media devices, such as .205139.4
