11 RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION; AMENDING THE LEGISLATIVE LOTTERY  
12 TUITION SCHOLARSHIP ACT; PROVIDING FOR DIFFERENTIATED AWARDS;  
13 PROVIDING AN APPLICATION PROCESS; REQUIRING ADDITIONAL  
14 REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.

15  
16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

17 SECTION 1. A new section of the Legislative Lottery  
18 Tuition Scholarship Act is enacted to read:

19 "[NEW MATERIAL] LOTTERY TUITION SCHOLARSHIP--REQUEST  
20 FORM--DEPARTMENT DETERMINATION.--

21 A. By August 1, 2017, the department shall develop  
22 and provide to all public post-secondary educational  
23 institutions a printed and electronic form for requesting a  
24 lottery tuition scholarship.

25 B. No later than July 1, 2017 and no later than May

1 l of each subsequent year, based on the amount appropriated by  
2 the legislature from the fund and on the projected enrollment  
3 at all public post-secondary educational institutions, the  
4 department shall:

5 (1) determine the total amount of money  
6 available for lottery tuition scholarships at all public post-  
7 secondary educational institutions;

8 (2) maintain, increase or reduce the  
9 percentages of lottery tuition scholarships to award the  
10 maximum amount available while maintaining the solvency of the  
11 fund as projected in the most recent actuarial evaluation of  
12 the fund; and

13 (3) notify all public post-secondary  
14 educational institutions of the determinations made pursuant to  
15 Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection."

16 SECTION 2. A new section of the Legislative Lottery  
17 Tuition Scholarship Act is enacted to read:

18 "[NEW MATERIAL] LOTTERY TUITION SCHOLARSHIP--APPLICATION  
19 BY STUDENT.--Prior to consideration for a lottery tuition  
20 scholarship each year, a student shall timely:

21 A. submit to the intended public post-secondary  
22 educational institution a signed form requesting a lottery  
23 tuition scholarship; and

24 B. file a free application for federal student aid  
25 provided pursuant to the federal Higher Education Act of 1965

2 SECTION 3. Section 21-21N-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2014,  
3 Chapter 80, Section 4, as amended) is repealed and a new  
4 Section 21-21N-4 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:

5 "21-21N-4. [NEW MATERIAL] LOTTERY TUITION SCHOLARSHIP--  
6 DIFFERENTIATED AWARDS.--

7 A. The amount of a lottery tuition scholarship  
8 shall be a percentage of tuition and shall be based on the  
9 program semester of enrollment and the type of public post-  
10 secondary educational institution the student is attending as  
11 follows:

12 (1) for students attending a community  
13 college:

14 (a) for the first and second program  
15 semesters, up to sixty percent of tuition; and

16 (b) for the third program semester, up  
17 to one hundred percent of tuition;

18 (2) for students attending a comprehensive  
19 institution:

20 (a) for the first program semester, up  
21 to forty percent of tuition;

22 (b) for the second and third program  
23 semesters, up to fifty percent of tuition;

24 (c) for the fourth program semester, up  
25 to eighty percent of tuition; and

1 (d) for the fifth through seventh  
2 program semesters, up to one hundred percent of tuition; and

3 (3) for students attending a research  
4 institution:

5 (a) for the first program semester, up  
6 to forty percent of tuition;

7 (b) for the second and third program  
8 semesters, up to fifty percent of tuition;

9 (c) for the fourth program semester, up  
10 to eighty percent of tuition; and

11 (d) for the fifth through seventh  
12 program semesters, up to one hundred percent of tuition.

13 B. In determining distribution and awards for the  
14 lottery tuition scholarship program, the department shall:

15 (1) maintain the minimum fund balance pursuant  
16 to Section 21-21N-5 NMSA 1978;

17 (2) distribute to all public post-secondary  
18 educational institutions an amount not to exceed the remaining  
19 balance in the fund; and

20 (3) subject to the provisions of Paragraphs  
21 (1) and (2) of this subsection, distribute to each public  
22 post-secondary educational institution an amount based on:

23 (a) the projected enrollment at each  
24 four-year public post-secondary educational institution of  
25 qualified students in their first through seventh program

1 semesters, including qualified students in their fourth through  
2 seventh program semesters who transferred from community  
3 colleges;

4 (b) the projected enrollment at each  
5 community college of qualified students in their first through  
6 third program semesters; and

7 (c) a uniform percentage of the average  
8 of in-state tuition costs charged by: 1) research institutions  
9 for each research institution; 2) comprehensive institutions  
10 for each comprehensive institution; and 3) community colleges  
11 for each community college, except that the uniform percentage  
12 for a two-year state educational institution shall be based on  
13 the uniform percentage for community colleges."

14 SECTION 4. Section 21-21N-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2014,  
15 Chapter 80, Section 6) is amended to read:

16 "21-21N-6. DEPARTMENT RULEMAKING AND REPORTING.--

17 A. The department shall promulgate rules setting  
18 forth explicit criteria in accordance with the Legislative  
19 Lottery Tuition Scholarship Act for:

20 (1) student qualification and continuing  
21 eligibility; ~~and~~

22 ~~(2) calculating the tuition scholarship award~~  
23 ~~amount pursuant to Section 4 of the Legislative Lottery Tuition~~  
24 ~~Scholarship Act and guidelines for the administration of the~~  
25 ~~tuition scholarship program]~~

7                   B. Immediately after promulgation, the rules shall  
8 be distributed to boards of regents and governing boards of  
9 public post-secondary educational institutions.

11 of each year to the legislative finance committee and the  
12 department of finance and administration on:

13                                 (1) the status of the fund;

14                                 (2) tuition scholarship program

15 participation data aggregated for each public post-secondary  
16 educational institution to show:

17                                         (a) the number of qualified students and  
18 the number of legacy students who received tuition scholarships  
19 in the prior twelve-month period;

20                                         (b) the total number of students,  
21 including qualified students and legacy students, enrolled in  
22 the prior twelve-month period;

23                                         (c) for each qualified student and each  
24 legacy student, the component amounts of the lottery tuition  
25 scholarship received and the amount of unmet need that was not
