- (1) for a state agency, money received by the state agency and deposited into the general fund or another state fund. "Revenue" includes money from taxes, fines, fees, royalties, federal funds and other sources but does not include money deposited into a state suspense fund; or
- (2) for a local education provider, all money received by the local education provider, including federal and state grants, state distributions, property tax revenues and donations; [and
- H.] I. "state agency" means the New Mexico state government or any department, division, institution, board, bureau, commission or committee of state government and includes any office or officer [of any of the above] thereof;

K. "transparency website" means a website provided by a state agency for the purpose of providing the public with information for the purpose of providing governmental transparency and accountability to taxpayers."

SECTION 2. Section 10-16D-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010, Chapter 34, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:

"10-16D-3. SUNSHINE PORTAL--DEPARTMENT DUTIES.--

- A. The department [with the department of finance and administration] shall develop, operate and maintain [a single internet web site that is] the sunshine portal, that is free, user-friendly, searchable and accessible to the public, [known as the "sunshine portal"] to host the state's financial and public information for the purpose of governmental transparency and accountability to taxpayers.
- B. No later than October 1, 2010, the department shall create the architecture and the information exchange process for the collection and electronic publication of the state's financial information.
- C. No later than July 1, 2011, the sunshine portal shall be available for public access and include updated information as required by Subsection D of this section.
- D. The sunshine portal shall provide, at a minimum, access to the following information:
 - (1) the state's financial information,

- State agencies shall provide updated financial information as frequently as possible but at least monthly.
- The department shall update the [web site] website as new information is received but at least monthly, [include] including information from the previous month or year, where relevant, for comparison purposes and maintain the [web site] website as the primary source of public information about the activity of the state government."

SECTION 3. Section 10-16D-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010, Chapter 34, Section 4) is amended to read:

"10-16D-4. RULES PROMULGATION--COMPLIANCE REQUIRED.--.207032.4

- A. Pursuant to the State Rules Act, the department shall promulgate rules necessary to implement the architecture, information exchange process and maintenance of the sunshine portal pursuant to the Sunshine Portal Transparency Act.
- B. Pursuant to the State Rules Act, the department of finance and administration shall promulgate rules to carry out the provisions of the Sunshine Portal Transparency Act.
- C. Pursuant to the State Rules Act, the department shall promulgate rules to create the architecture and the information exchange process for the collection and electronic publication of the state's public information that is not financial information.
- [G.] D. All state agencies shall comply with the provisions of the Sunshine Portal Transparency Act and rules promulgated by the department and the department of finance and administration pursuant to that act."
- SECTION 4. Section 10-16D-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010, Chapter 34, Section 5) is amended to read:
 - "10-16D-5. PROTECTION OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION.--
- $\underline{A.}$ Nothing in the Sunshine Portal Transparency Act shall require disclosure of information that is confidential by state or federal law, <u>rule or regulation.</u>
- B. No agency shall be required to post on the sunshine portal or any transparency website information for which the agency head has made a written determination that .207032.4
