RELATING TO TORTS; AMENDING A SECTION OF THE TORT CLAIMS ACT								
TO PROVIDE FOR AN EXCLUSION FROM THE WAIVER OF IMMUNITY FOR								
IRRIGATION AND CONSERVANCY DISTRICTS THAT AUTHORIZE PART OF								
THEIR PROPERTY FOR USE AS A ROADWAY BY THE PUBLIC OR A								
GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY.								

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 41-4-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1976, Chapter 58, Section 11, as amended) is amended to read:

"41-4-11. LIABILITY--HIGHWAYS AND STREETS.--

A. The immunity granted pursuant to Subsection A of Section 41-4-4 NMSA 1978 does not apply to liability for damages resulting from bodily injury, wrongful death or property damage caused by the negligence of public employees while acting within the scope of their duties during the construction, and in subsequent maintenance, of any bridge, culvert, highway, roadway, street, alley, sidewalk or parking area.

B. The liability for which immunity has been waived pursuant to Subsection A of this section shall not include liability for damages caused by:

(1) a defect in plan or design of any bridge, culvert, highway, roadway, street, alley, sidewalk or parking area;

1	(2) the failure to construct or reconstruct
2	any bridge, culvert, highway, roadway, street, alley,
3	sidewalk or parking area; or
4	(3) a deviation from standard geometric
5	design practices for any bridge, culvert, highway, roadway,
6	street, alley, sidewalk or parking area allowed on a case-by-
7	case basis for appropriate cultural, ecological, economic,
8	environmental, right-of-way through Indian lands, historical
9	or technical reasons; provided that the deviation:
10	(a) is required by extraordinary
