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9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
10	SECTION 1. STATEWIDE ADVANCED PLACEMENT POLICY
11	A. Beginning with the 2017-2018 academic year,
12	public post-secondary educational institutions shall accept a
13	score of 3 or higher on the advanced placement examination
14	for post-secondary level course credit. Institutions that
15	offer a corresponding course for a particular advanced
16	placement examination as a part of their general education
17	degree requirements shall accept a score of 3 or higher on
18	the advanced placement examination for course credit as part
19	of their general education degree requirements. If an
20	institution does not offer a corresponding course for a
21	particular advanced placement examination, the institution
22	shall award, at a minimum, elective post-secondary level
23	course credit for those students who receive a score of 3 or
24	higher on that advanced placement examination.
25	B. Each public post-secondary educational SB 208

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institution shall determine the score for each advanced placement examination for the institution to grant credit for a course. Each institution shall publish its updated course-granting policy for advanced placement in accordance with the requirements of this subsection on its website before the beginning of the 2017-2018 academic year.

C. The higher education department, in cooperation with all public post-secondary educational institutions, shall collect and report the course-granting policy for advanced placement of each institution and the research used by each institution to determine the level of credit and the number of credits provided for the advanced placement examination scores and file a report that includes findings and recommendations to the legislature and the governor. Each institution shall provide the department with all necessary data, in accordance with the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, to allow the department to conduct its analysis._____ SB 208 Page 2

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
