5	WHEREAS, the health care needs of American Indians are	
6	unique and include many unaddressed issues; and	
7	WHEREAS, according to the department of health, American	
8	Indians in New Mexico bear a disproportionate share of poor	
9	health status and disease; and	
10	WHEREAS, access to health care services varies greatly	
11	between urban Indians and Indians who reside on reservations;	
12	and	
13	WHEREAS, funding for Indian health services has	
14	historically been inadequate in New Mexico and throughout the	
15	United States; and	
16	WHEREAS, the passage of relevant portions of the federal	
17	Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and the permanent	
18	reauthorization of the federal Indian Health Care Improvement	
19	Act offer significant opportunities for tribes and Native	
20	American communities to contribute to the improved health and	
21	well-being of American Indians in New Mexico; and	
22	WHEREAS, the health and well-being of American Indians	
23	in New Mexico have benefited from increased tribal	
24	participation in and expansion of tribal health programs; and	
25	WHEREAS, the support, funding and opportunities provided	SJM 23 Page 1

by the passage of relevant portions of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and the permanent reauthorization of the Indian Health Care Improvement Act have expanded and strengthened Indian sovereignty by allowing New Mexico Indian pueblos, tribes and nations to take ownership of the resources now available and to contribute in a meaningful way to the improved health of all American Indians in New Mexico; and

9 WHEREAS, the protection of the Indian Health Care
10 Improvement Act ensures that tribes and Native American
11 communities can continue to contribute to the improved health
12 and well-being of American Indians in New Mexico;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that it protect health care for American Indians in New Mexico; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the New Mexico congressional delegation be called upon to urge their colleagues in the United States congress to support measures to protect the Indian Health Care Improvement Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the president of the United States, the governor and the members of the New Mexico congressional delegation.
