SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 315 amends Section 66-5-29 NMSA 1978 to include any offense under the Federal Controlled Substances Act or the New Mexico Controlled Substances Act or any other drug offense would result in the Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) immediately revoking the driving privilege or driver's license of a driver upon receiving record of the offense whether under state law or local ordinance.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

MVD would need to create a new offense code in order to identify the offense as a federal violation. Implementation of this bill requires effort to set up a new violation code and DWI revocation process changes to immediately revoke the driving privilege of a driver upon receiving the record of the offense.
