SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 499 changes the purposes and authorizations for the expenditure of supplemental severance tax bond (SSTB) proceeds, suspends for one year severance tax bond (STB) allocations to water, tribal, and colonias infrastructure funds, reverts unexpended balances from the fire protection and fire protection grant funds, authorizes funding for museum projects from the arts in public places fund, and authorizes the State Board of Finance to issue short-term SSTB and senior STB. The bill contains an emergency clause. (See Attachment A: Capital Outlay Projects Voided in Sections 2 and 6)

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

House Bill 499, Section 1, proposes and allows the issuance of no more than \$63.7 million of 2017 non-recurring taxable supplemental severance tax bond capacity of which the proceeds are appropriated to the general fund (GF). Collectively, the various voids and reauthorizations contained in the bill would provide a non-recurring \$69.8 million to general fund reserves.

Section 2, voids the unexpended and unencumbered balances of certain taxable STB projects appropriated prior to 2016 totaling \$4.1 million with proceeds directed to the general fund. The provision allows the Department of Finance and Administration to reauthorize the proceeds to restore GF capital expenditures made on or before June 30, 2016.

Section 3, voids the authorization of \$2 million appropriated from the fire protection and the fire protection grant funds for a fire fighter burn building in Socorro. The proceeds of the voided projects are directed to the GF in fiscal year 2017.

Sections 4 and 5 suspends for one year \$20.8 million from STB earmarked for the water, tribal, and the colonias infrastructure funds in fiscal year 2017. The suspension of the funds will increase 2017 STB capacity from \$61.9 million to \$82.7 million.

Section 6, voids the unexpended and unencumbered balances of certain tax-exempt STB projects appropriated prior to 2016 totaling \$19 million with proceeds directed to the public school capital outlay fund (PSCOF) for use by the public school capital outlay council in fiscal years 2018 through 2022 for implementation of the Public School Capital Outlay Act.

Section 7, authorizes the issuance of no more than \$74.8 million of new 2017 STB capacity, of which \$44.7 million is appropriated to the PSCOF to restore the fund as per the proposal in Section 1. The bill further authorizes issuance of \$30.1 million of new STB for the following amounts and projects: \$10 million for economic development projects statewide, \$10 million to the Department of Information and Technology for communication upgrades, \$9.1 million to the Indian water rights settlement fund, \$835,600 to the Office of State Engineer for water rights adjudication, and \$208,900 to the Administrative Office of the Courts for costs associated with water rights adjudication.

Section 8, authorizes the issuance of SSTB capacity totaling \$25 million for appropriation to the PSCOF for the purpose of funding the instructional material fund (\$17.5 million) and public school fund (\$7.5 million) for fiscal year 2018.

Section 9, transfers balances totaling \$1.6 million in the art in public places fund to the Cultural Affairs Department for capital improvements to exhibits.

Sections 10, 11, and 12 provide the authorization to the State Board of Finance to issue the bonds specified within the bill, provides a severability clause in the event any of the projects listed within the bill are held invalid or otherwise cannot be effectuated, and provides for an emergency clause.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The overview of executive recommendations released on January 10, 2017, proposes to use the 2017 severance tax bond capacity totaling approximately \$61.9 million to exchange with taxable supplemental severance tax bonds in the same amount for transfer to the states' reserves. The executive proposal would mean no new capacity for capital outlay projects in 2017 except those appropriations for purposes specified in Section 7 of this bill. The executive supports suspending allocations to the water, tribal, and colonias funds for one year for use for water rights settlements and acquisitions, water rights adjudication, public safety and economic development initiatives.

For 2017, state agency priority capital requests total \$502.7 million while higher education institutions and special and tribal school requests total \$82.1 million. The LFC staff "framework" for consideration by the full Legislature listed in Volume III of the LFC Budget Documents and incorporated into Senate Bill 101 is based on criteria, site visits, reviews of infrastructure capital improvement plans, monthly meetings with major departments, and testimony at hearings held in the interim. The proposed projects reflect the most critical projects impacting public health and safety and ongoing projects requiring additional funds to complete. Authorizations to expend money from "other state funds" for capital projects are also listed in Volume III.

CONFLICT, DUPLICATION, COMPANIONSHIP, RELATIONSHIP

House Appropriations & Finance Committee Substitute for House Bill 2 appropriates \$25 million SSTB capacity from the public school capital outlay fund (PSCOF), \$12.5 million for the instructional material fund and \$12.5 million to the public education fund for transportation for expenditure in FY18. House Bill 499 appropriates \$25 million SSTB capacity from the PSCOF, \$17.5 million to the instructional material fund and \$7.5 million to the public school fund for transportation for expenditure in FY18.

Senate Bill 101 authorizes \$89.4 million, \$64.1 million from severance tax bond (STB) capacity and \$25.3 million from other state funds, for the purpose of funding 54 capital outlay projects for state-owned and –operated facilities statewide.

Senate Bill 112, as amended, reauthorizes taxable bond proceeds and other state funds to restore general fund (GF) capital expenditures made on or before June 30, 2016. The bill suspends for one year the STB capacity earmarked for water, tribal, and colonias infrastructure funds, and provides for non-recurring use of STB capacity to assist in addressing solvency issues. The amendments increase GF reserves by a non-recurring \$27.8 million in fiscal year 2017 rather than the \$40.1 million proposed in the original bill.

Senate Bill 260 voids capital outlay projects totaling approximately \$10.7 million appropriated from STB capacity. Of the total, \$7.2 million is for bonds not issued as of January 1, 2017 and approximately \$3.5 million is for projects appropriated from STB with no encumbrances and expenses made prior to 2015.

TECHNICAL ISSUES

Sections 8 and 10 of the bill contain contradictory language pertaining to which agency certifies the need for an appropriation and which agency certifies to the State Board of Finance the need for the issuance of supplemental severance tax bonds. Historically, the Public Education Department certifies to the Public School Capital Outlay Council the need for issuance of supplemental severance tax bonds and the Council in turn certifies to the State Board of Finance the need for the issuance of the bonds. It is unknown if the sponsor intended the certification to the Board of Finance be made by the either the PSCOC "or" the secretary of the Public Education Department.

OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

The Department of Informational Technology analysis indicates the \$10 million appropriation within the bill is intended to "plan, design, acquire, purchase, and implement infrastructure to stabilize and modernize statewide public safety communications." It should be noted the electorate in November 2016 overwhelming passed a general obligation bond for \$5 million for the same purpose. General obligation bonds are expected to be issued in March or April 2017 with proceeds appropriated to DoIT in March or April, 2017 for the purposes stated in this bill.
