#### **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

As proposed, this bill would adopt *La Marcha de Los Novios* as the official dance of New Mexico.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SB 449 carries no appropriation and will not have a fiscal impact on the Department of Cultural Affairs.

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

The Cultural Affairs Department states that although *La Marcha de Los Novios* is a culturally important dance in New Mexico, designation of this song as the official dance of New Mexico through legislation singles out one cultural traditional dance over other cultural dances without a public process or wider public input.

# OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

As proposed, this bill does not require a public process to determine the designation of an official state dance. Without public input, it is difficult to assure that this particular dance is representational of New Mexico's diverse dance heritage.
