12	BE TRANSFERRED OUT OF A LOCAL OPTION DISTRICT INTACT; ALLOWING
13	CERTAIN DISPENSER'S LICENSES TO REINSTATE RETAIL PRIVILEGES.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. Section 60-6B-12 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1981,
17	Chapter 39, Section 113, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"60-6B-12. INTER-LOCAL OPTION DISTRICT AND INTER-COUNTY
19	TRANSFERS
20	A. Dispenser's and retailer's licenses originally
21	issued before July 1, 1981, except rural dispenser's and rural
22	retailer's licenses and canopy licenses that were replaced by
23	dispenser's licenses pursuant to Section 60-6B-16 NMSA 1978,
24	may be transferred to any location within the state, except
25	class B counties having a population of between fifty-six
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1 thousand and fifty-seven thousand according to the 1980 federal 2 decennial census, the municipalities located within those class 3 B counties and any municipality or county that prohibits by election the transfer of a license from another local option 4 5 district, without regard to the limitations on the maximum number of licenses provided in Section 60-6A-18 NMSA 1978, not 6 7 otherwise contrary to law, subject to the approval of transferring locations of those liquor licenses by the 8 9 governing body for that location; provided that the requirements of the Liquor Control Act and department 10 regulations for the transfer of licenses are fulfilled; and 11 12 provided further that:

(1) beginning in calendar year 1997, no more than ten dispenser's or retailer's licenses shall be transferred to any local option district in any calendar year; and

(2) the dispenser's or retailer's licenses transferred under this section shall count in the computation of the limitation of the maximum number of licenses that may be issued in the future in any local option district as provided in Section 60-6A-18 NMSA 1978 for the purpose of determining whether additional licenses may be issued in the local option district under the provisions of Subsection H of Section 60-6B-2 NMSA 1978.

B. Transfer of location of a liquor license .209383.1

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1 pursuant to Subsection A of this section shall become effective 2 upon approval of the local governing body, unless within one 3 hundred twenty days after the effective date of the Liquor Control Act a petition requesting an election on the question 4 of approval of statewide transfers of liquor licenses into that 5 local option district is filed with the clerk of the local 6 7 option district and the petition is signed by at least five percent of the number of registered voters of the district. 8 9 The clerk of the district shall verify the petition signatures. If the petition is verified as containing the required number 10 of signatures of registered voters, the governing body shall 11 12 adopt a resolution calling an election on the question of approving or disapproving statewide transfers of liquor 13 licenses into that district. Notice of such election shall be 14 published as provided in Section 3-8-35 NMSA 1978, and the 15 election shall be held within sixty days after the date the 16 petition is verified or it may be held in conjunction with a 17 regular election of the governing body if such election occurs 18 within sixty days after the date of verification. 19 If a 20 majority of the registered voters of the district voting in such election votes to approve statewide transfers of liquor 21 licenses into the local option district, each license proposing 22 to be transferred shall be subject to the approval of the 23 governing body. If the voters of the district voting in the 24 election vote against the approval, then all statewide 25

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transfers of liquor licenses pursuant to Subsection A of this section shall be prohibited in that district, unless a petition is filed requesting the question be again submitted to the voters as provided in this subsection. The question of approving or disapproving statewide transfers of liquor licenses into the local option district shall not be submitted again within two years from the date of the last election on the question.

[C. Any dispenser's license transferred pursuant to this section outside its local option district shall only 10 entitle the licensee to sell, serve or permit the consumption 12 of alcoholic beverages by the drink on the licensed premises.

D.] C. Rural dispenser's, rural retailer's and rural club licenses issued under any former act may be transferred to any location, subject to the restrictions as to location contained in the Liquor Control Act, within the unincorporated area of the county in which they are currently located; provided that they shall not be transferred to any location within ten miles of another licensed premises; and provided further that all requirements of the Liquor Control Act and department regulations for the transfer of licenses are fulfilled.

D. A dispenser's license that, under previous law, lost the privilege to sell alcoholic beverages in unbroken packages for consumption and not for resale off the licensed .209383.1 - 4 -

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1	premises as a result of transferring out of its original local
2	option district may have the privilege reinstated if the
3	licensee pays seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to the
4	department."
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
