WHEREAS, New Mexico's public lands feature an amazingly diverse range of landscapes, from the snow-capped peaks of the Rocky mountains to rushing rivers, rock canyons, grassy plains, desert landscapes and tree-lined mountain valleys; and

WHEREAS, New Mexicans of all races, ethnicities, occupations and lifestyles continue to derive multiple benefits from the traditional, long-standing multiple-use management philosophy of public lands under the stewardship of the United States forest service and the federal bureau of land management; and

WHEREAS, these practices reflect the public support for
policies incorporating a judicious balance between aesthetic,
recreational and economic values; and
