SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 164 amends sections of the Beef Council Act to provide for producers to opt-out of the council assessment. HB164 also amends the method for determining how much the council is obligated to pay the NMLB for managing collection of assessments; currently, the council pays the NMLB four cents per head, HB164 would change the rate to "no more than four cents per one dollar collected." The current assessment rate is one dollar per head.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The NMLB could lose up to \$53 thousand in revenue generated by beef council fee administration should all cattle growers opt-out of beef council fees; this figure is based on 1.33 million transfers at four cents per transfer. Additionally, NMLB would need to update the brand database at an estimated one-time cost of \$2 thousand.
