SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 43 appropriates \$1.1 million from the Public Project Revolving Fund (PPRF), administered by the New Mexico Finance Authority, to the Wastewater Facility Construction Loan Fund, also known as the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF), administered by the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED). The appropriation will be used as the program's state match to a federal capitalization grant provided under the Clean Water Act. The use of the appropriation is consistent with Section 6-21-6.1(C)(1) of the New Mexico Finance Authority Act which delineates eligible appropriations from the PPRF to other funds.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

NMFA reports:

The appropriation reduces the amount the PPRF can lend to qualified borrowers; however, this appropriation is an eligible appropriation from PPRF funds as provided by the Act.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The appropriation contained in SB43 provides the required state match, to federal funds for the CWSRF.

NMED reports that at the end of November, 2017, the CWSRF had an unobligated balance of \$83.5 million.

WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

The state would need to find alternative funds to serve as a state match for the federal capitalization grant provided under the Clean Water Act.
