A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING CONGRESS TO PASS THE FIX IT AMERICA CONSTITUTIONAL  
AMENDMENT.

WHEREAS, there is broad bipartisan support for fair elections and governance in New Mexico and across the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, there is agreement on the underlying principle that the role of money in elections and governance should be transparent, prevent corruption and protect against the buying of access to or influence over representatives; and

WHEREAS, there is further recognition that district lines drawn to intentionally or unduly favor or disfavor a political party undermine the most basic principles of fairness in elections and governance; and

WHEREAS, the proposed fix it America constitutional

1 amendment provides:

2 "Section I. Congress and State Legislatures shall  
3 regulate the role of money in elections and  
4 governance to ensure transparency, prevent  
5 corruption, and protect against the buying of access  
6 to or influence over representatives. No such  
7 regulation shall be deemed in violation of freedom  
8 of speech rights in the Constitution of the United  
9 States or its Amendments.

10 Section II. Legislative districts or districting  
11 plans shall not intentionally or unduly favor or  
12 disfavor any political party.";

14 WHEREAS, the proposed fix it America constitutional  
15 amendment expressly empowers congress and state legislatures to  
16 maintain fairness when it comes to these issues;

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE  
18 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the fix it America constitutional  
19 amendment be submitted to the United States congress with a  
20 request that it be passed by the required two-thirds' vote and  
21 submitted to the states for ratification; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be  
23 transmitted to the members of New Mexico's congressional  
24 delegation.
