11	EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR A STUDY OF CARBON FEE AND DIVIDEND

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14	WHEREAS, the weight of scientific evidence indicates that
15	greenhouse gas emissions from human activities, including the
16	burning of fossil fuels and other sources, are causing rising
17	global temperatures; and
18	WHEREAS, the weight of scientific evidence also indicates
19	that a return from the current concentration of more than four
20	hundred parts per million of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere
21	to three hundred fifty parts per million of carbon dioxide or
22	less is necessary to slow or stop the rise in global
23	temperatures; and
24	WHEREAS, further increases in global temperatures pose
25	imminent and substantial dangers to human health, the natural

WHEREAS, several other states have begun to address greenhouse gas emissions, with carbon pricing bills already introduced in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Washington, New York, Oregon, California and Vermont, with various active campaigns in other states; and

9 WHEREAS, carbon fee and dividend legislation could be
10 considered as a component of the New Mexico energy roadmap, a
11 project created to define the steps needed to move to a more
12 diverse energy portfolio while improving economic outcomes for
13 New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, phasing in carbon fees on greenhouse gas emissions is the most efficient, transparent and enforceable mechanism to drive an effective and fair transition to a lowcarbon energy economy, stimulate investment in alternative energy technologies and give all businesses powerful incentives to increase their energy efficiency and reduce their carbon footprints in order to remain competitive; and

WHEREAS, equal monthly dividends from one hundred percent of the net carbon fees will be paid to every New Mexico household to help ensure that families and individuals can afford the energy they need during the transition to a low-carbon economy, which will also stimulate the economy; .208924.1

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE
 OF NEW MEXICO that a study of carbon fee and dividend
 legislation be supported; and
 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the appropriate legislative
 interim committee study how a possible state revenue-neutral
 carbon fee could be implemented in New Mexico and its effects
