11	RELATING TO CRIME; REQUIRING A BACKGROUND CHECK WHEN CONDUCTING
12	SALES OF A FIREARM; PROVIDING PENALTIES.

14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. A new section of Chapter 30, Article 7 NMSA
16	1978 is enacted to read:
17	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] UNLAWFUL SALE OF A FIREARM WITHOUT A
18	BACKGROUND CHECK
19	A. Unlawful sale of a firearm without a background
20	check consists of the sale of a firearm without conducting a
21	federal instant background check where the sale is made for a
22	fee or other consideration.
23	B. The provisions of Subsection A of this section
24	do not apply to the sale of a firearm:
25	(1) by or to a person who holds a current and

1 valid federal firearms license issued pursuant to 18 U.S.C. 2 Section 923(a); 3 (2) to a law enforcement agency; or between two law enforcement officers 4 (3) 5 certified pursuant to the Law Enforcement Training Act and authorized to carry a firearm. 6 7 C. As used in this section: "federal instant background check" means a (1)8 9 background check that meets the requirements of 18 U.S.C. Section 922(t) and that does not indicate that a sale to the 10 person receiving the firearm would violate 18 U.S.C. Section 11 12 922(g) or 18 U.S.C. Section 922(n) or state law; "firearm" means any weapon that will or is (2)13 14 designed to or may readily be converted to expel a projectile by the action of an explosion; the frame or receiver of any 15 such weapon; or any firearm muffler or firearm silencer; and 16 includes any handgun, rifle or shotgun; and 17 "sale" means the sale, delivery or passing 18 (3) 19 of ownership, possession or control of a firearm for a fee or 20 other consideration, but does not include temporary possession or control of a firearm provided to a customer by the 21 proprietor of a licensed business in the conduct of that 22 business. 23 Each party to an unlawful sale in violation of D. 24 this section may be separately charged for the same sale. 25

complaint, information or indictment and shall be punished as

is guilty of a misdemeanor."
