## HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL 523

RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION; DECLARING AS AN UNLAWFUL
PRACTICE AUTOMATIC WITHDRAWALS MADE PURSUANT TO AUTOMATIC
PAYMENT AGREEMENTS FROM CERTAIN CONSUMER ACCOUNTS WITHOUT PRIOR
OR IMMEDIATE NOTICE OF THOSE WITHDRAWALS; PROVIDING A
DEFINITION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

**SECTION 1.** A new section of the Unfair Practices Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] AUTOMATIC PAYMENT AGREEMENTS--NOTICE
REQUIRED.--

A. It is an unlawful practice within the meaning of the Unfair Practices Act for a person that has an automatic payment agreement with a consumer to fail to notify the consumer of each withdrawal from the consumer's credit or debit .214814.4

account, or the consumer's account with a third party, prior to or immediately upon making that withdrawal.

- For purposes of this section, "automatic payment agreement" means an agreement between a creditor and a consumer that authorizes the creditor to periodically withdraw money from a credit card or a checking or savings account to pay a bill.
- С. The provisions of this section shall not apply to a federally insured depository institution or to an insurer as defined in Section 59A-1-8 NMSA 1978."
