23	A. For purposes of this section, "a student who has
24	experienced disruption in the student's education" means a
25	student who experiences one or more changes in <u>public</u> school or

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1 school district enrollment during a single school year as the 2 result of: homelessness as defined in the federal 3 (1) McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act as determined by the 4 5 public school or school district; adjudication: 6 (2) 7 (a) as an abused or neglected child as determined by the children, youth and families department 8 9 pursuant to the Abuse and Neglect Act; (b) as part of a family in need of 10 court-ordered services voluntary placement pursuant to the 11 12 Family Services Act; or (c) as a delinquent if the parent wishes 13 14 to disclose the adjudication of delinquency; or placement in a mental health treatment 15 (3) facility or habilitation program for developmental disabilities 16 pursuant to the Children's Mental Health and Developmental 17 Disabilities Act or placement in treatment foster care. 18 19 Β. When a student who has experienced a disruption 20 in the student's education transfers to a new public school or school district, the receiving public school or school district 21 shall communicate with the sending school district within two 22 days of the student's enrollment. The sending public school or 23 school district shall provide the receiving public school or 24 school district with any requested records within two days of 25 .212166.1 - 2 -

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having received the receiving <u>public</u> school's or school district's communication.

C. A student who has experienced a disruption in the student's education transferring to a new <u>public</u> school as the result of circumstances set forth in this section shall have:

(1) priority placement in classes that meet state graduation requirements; and

9 (2) timely placement in elective classes that
10 are comparable to those in which the student was enrolled at
11 the student's previous <u>public</u> school or <u>public</u> schools as soon
12 as the <u>public</u> school or school district receives verification
13 from the student's records.

D. For a student who has experienced disruption in the student's education at any time during the student's high school enrollment, a school district and public schools shall ensure:

(1) acceptance of the student's state graduation requirements for a diploma of excellence pursuant to the Public School Code;

(2) equal access to participation in sports and other extracurricular activities, career and technical programs or other special programs for which the student qualifies;

(3) timely assistance and advice from .212166.1

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1	counselors to improve the student's college or career
2	readiness; and
3	(4) that the student receives all special
4	education services to which the student is entitled.
5	E. Students who transfer between public schools
6	<u>in different school districts or between public schools</u>
7	within the same school district shall receive credit for any
8	work completed prior to the transfer, regardless of whether
9	the transfer occurred at the end of a grading period. School
10	districts, with guidance from the department, shall create
11	policies to determine how credit shall be awarded for courses
12	that are partially completed."
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
