I request that the following be funded:

- to the office of the state engineer

BLOOMFIELD IRRIGATION DIST DITCH IMPROVE

six hundred forty-five thousand five hundred thirty-seven dollars (\$645,537) to plan, design and construct improvements to the district irrigation ditch, including the Blanco flume, for the Bloomfield irrigation district in San Juan county

- to the Indian affairs department

NAVAJO PREPARATORY SCHL SECURITY & COM

two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to plan, design, construct, purchase, equip and install security and communications systems equipment at the Navajo preparatory school in San Juan county

- to the interstate stream commission

ELEDGE DITCH IMPROVE SAN JUAN CO

one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to plan, design and construct improvements to the Eledge ditch in San Juan county

- to the local government division of the department of finance and administration

VALENCIA SWCD WHITFIELD VISITOR CTR PH 2

six hundred thirty-four thousand six hundred twenty-five dollars (\$634,625) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip phase 2 of the Whitfield visitor and education center for the Valencia soil and water conservation district in Valencia county

NM HWY 371/NAVAJO RTE 36 TRAFFIC SIGNAL

one million six hundred eighty-seven thousand eighty-six dollars (\$1,687,086) to plan, design, construct, purchase and install a traffic signal and related road work, including widening, at the intersection of New Mexico highway 371 and Navajo route 36 in San Juan county

NM HWY 170 IMPROVE FARMINGTON

seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) to plan, design and construct improvements to New Mexico highway 170 in Farmington in San Juan county

NM HWY 64 IMPROVE FARMINGTON

one million dollars (\$1,000,000) to plan, design and construct improvements to New Mexico highway 64, including drainage, bridge and intersections, in Farmington in San Juan county
