1 AN ACT 2 RELATING TO TORTS; AMENDING A SECTION OF THE TORT CLAIMS ACT 3 TO PROVIDE FOR AN EXCLUSION FROM THE WAIVER OF IMMUNITY FOR IRRIGATION AND CONSERVANCY DISTRICTS THAT AUTHORIZE PART OF 4 5 THEIR PROPERTY FOR USE AS A ROADWAY BY THE PUBLIC OR A 6 GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY. 7 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: 9 SECTION 1. Section 41-4-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1976, 10 Chapter 58, Section 11, as amended) is amended to read: 11 "41-4-11. LIABILITY--HIGHWAYS AND STREETS.--12 The immunity granted pursuant to Subsection A Α. 13 of Section 41-4-4 NMSA 1978 does not apply to liability for 14 damages resulting from bodily injury, wrongful death or 15 property damage caused by the negligence of public employees 16 while acting within the scope of their duties during the 17 construction, and in subsequent maintenance, of any bridge, 18 culvert, highway, roadway, street, alley, sidewalk or parking 19 area. 20 Β. The liability for which immunity has been 21 waived pursuant to Subsection A of this section shall not 22 include liability for damages caused by: 23 (1) a defect in plan or design of any 24 bridge, culvert, highway, roadway, street, alley, sidewalk or 25 parking area;

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(2) 1 the failure to construct or reconstruct 2 any bridge, culvert, highway, roadway, street, alley, 3 sidewalk or parking area; or 4 a deviation from standard geometric (3) 5 design practices for any bridge, culvert, highway, roadway, 6 street, alley, sidewalk or parking area allowed on a case-bycase basis for appropriate cultural, ecological, economic, 7 environmental, right-of-way through Indian lands, historical 8 or technical reasons; provided that the deviation: 9 10 (a) is required by extraordinary circumstances; 11 (b) has been approved by the governing 12 authority; and 13 (c) is reasonable and necessary as 14 15 determined by the application of sound engineering principles taking into consideration the appropriate cultural, 16 ecological, economic, environmental, right-of-way through 17 Indian lands, historical or technical circumstances. 18 C. All irrigation and conservancy districts that 19 20 authorize a portion of their property to be used as a road available for use by the general public, and their employees 21 acting lawfully and within the scope of their duties, are 22 excluded from the waiver of immunity under Subsection A of 23 this section in regard to that portion of property; provided 24 that the: 25

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irrigation or conservancy district has (1) entered into a written agreement with the state agency or governmental entity operating and maintaining that road; and (2) state agency or governmental entity has agreed to assume the operation and maintenance of that portion of the district's property used for that road. The state agency or governmental entity D. operating and maintaining the road available for use by the general public pursuant to Subsection C of this section shall be subject to liability as provided in the Tort Claims Act."___ HB 202/a Page 3
