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7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
8	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
9	"Children's Advocacy Centers Act".
10	SECTION 2. DEFINITIONAs used in the Children's
11	Advocacy Centers Act, "center" means a children's advocacy
12	center, which is an entity that provides a comprehensive
13	multidisciplinary team response to allegations of child abuse
14	or neglect in a neutral, child-friendly setting by
15	representatives of the following fields and professions:
16	A. child protective services;
17	B. family and victim advocacy;
18	C. forensic interviewers;
19	D. law enforcement;
20	E. medical examiners;
21	F. behavioral health; and
22	G. services related to those fields and
23	professions listed in Subsections A through F of this
24	section.
25	SECTION 3. CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY CENTERSDUTIESA

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2	A. be an entity that is a private, incorporated
3	agency, a hospital or a governmental entity;
4	B. have a neutral, child-focused facility where
5	forensic interviews with children take place; provided that
6	all agencies shall have a place to interact with the child as
7	investigative or treatment needs require;
8	C. have a designated staff trained according to
9	standards approved by the national children's alliance;
10	D. have a multidisciplinary team established in
11	accordance with the provisions of the Children's Advocacy
12	Centers Act that meets on a regular basis, at least every
13	other month;
14	E. provide case tracking of child abuse cases seen
15	through the center. Case tracking or data collected shall
16	include:
17	(1) the number of child abuse cases seen at
18	the center;
19	(2) demographic data;
20	(3) the number of cases referred for
21	prosecution; and
22	(4) the number of cases referred for
23	behavioral health services, medical examinations and other
24	related services;

center shall:

1	services at the center or provide referrals for medical	
2	examinations or mental health therapy provided by an agency	
3	not located at the center but with which the center has a	
4	memorandum of understanding or interagency agreement;	
5	G. provide family and victim advocacy services to

7	H. facilitate the provision of training of center	
8	staff and multidisciplinary team members; and	
9	I. adhere to the national children's alliance	
10	standards.	
11	SECTION 4. MULTIDISCIPLINARY CHILD ABUSE TEAMS	
12	ESTABLISHMENTMEMBERSHIPDUTIES	
13	A. The following persons shall comprise a	
14	multidisciplinary child abuse investigation team in each	
15	judicial district in the state:	
16	(l) the district attorney of the judicial	
17	district in which the team is created and established, or the	
18	district attorney's designee;	
19	(2) a representative from the protective	
20	services division of the children, youth and families	
21	department, appointed by the director of the division or the	
22	director's designee;	
23	(3) a representative from a center that	
24	exists in the judicial district in which the team is located;

1	(4) the following members, appointed by the
2	agency head or designee of the following agencies:
3	(a) a representative from each law
4	enforcement agency within the judicial district;
5	(b) medical personnel with expertise
6	and certification in pediatric sexual assault, child physical
7	abuse and neglect identification or treatment;
8	(c) a mental health service provider
9	with training and experience in evidence-supported trauma-
10	focused cognitive behavioral therapy; and
11	(d) a family or victim advocate from an
12	agency designated for advocacy services in that judicial
13	district.
14	B. The following multidisciplinary child abuse
15	investigation team members shall be present before a forensic
16	interview can take place:
17	(1) the center's forensic interviewer; and
18	(2) when available and as appropriate:
19	(a) a representative from law
20	enforcement; and
21	(b) the representative from the
22	protective services division of the children, youth and
23	families department.
24	C. A multidisciplinary child abuse investigation

1	(l) develop a written protocol for the	
2	investigation and prosecution of cases of child abuse and	
3	neglect in accordance with each member agency's requirements;	
4	(2) convene on a regular ongoing basis, at	
5	least every other month, for the purpose of conducting case	
6	tracking, case review and general business and considering	
7	proposed modifications to the team's existing protocol; and	
8	(3) train and provide technical assistance	
9	to team members, agencies and medical providers that
