CC. contracts for investment advisory services, investment management services or other investment-related services entered into by the educational retirement board,

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the state investment officer or the retirement board created 1 2 pursuant to the Public Employees Retirement Act;

3 DD. the purchase for resale by the state fair commission of feed and other items necessary for the upkeep 4 of livestock; 5

EE. contracts entered into by the crime victims 6 reparation commission to distribute federal grants to assist 8 victims of crime, including grants from the federal Victims of Crime Act of 1984 and the federal Violence Against Women Act of 1994;

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FF. procurement by or through the children, youth 11 and families department of pre-kindergarten services 12 purchased pursuant to the Pre-Kindergarten Act; 13

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GG. procurement of services of commissioned 14 advertising sales representatives for New Mexico magazine; 15 and 16

HH. procurements exempt from the Procurement Code 17 as otherwise provided by law."_____ 18
